SHARP FIGHTING IN HAITI, 'Frisco Claims Bank

Factions at Gonaives.

ASKS WITHDRAWAL OF MARINES Citizens of Port Au Prince Say the

Presence of Foreign Forces in the Capital is No Longer Necessary. PORT AU PRINCE, Haltl, Feb. 2.

Sharp fighting has occurred at Gonaives between the followers of the two rival revolutionary leaders, Senator Danilmar Theodore and General Oreate Zamor, formerly government delegate at Haitlen. Only the most meager details were obtainable today concerning the battle-These came from the crews of Haitlen naval vessels which were lying at anchor in the roadstead of Gonaives, but which left soon as the firing started. The war craft arrived here today and their officers assert that they saw flames rising over a vast area, giving reason for the belief that the city of Gonaives had

been set on fire. The German cruiser Vineta left immediately for Gonalves to investigate. Senator Theodore, who announced several days ago that he would take supreme command of the rebels, was understood to be marching with his followers on the capital. His rival, General Zamor, was reported to have left Gonaives for the same destination at the head of revolutionary troops.
