

Will be used. These will be auspended from the domes and facades of buildings and when the colored rays of powerful scarchlights pass through them they will scintillate like precious stones.

Will Be Replica of the Grand Canyon

With large shipments of gray sand stone, mountain sage and cactus taker from the rim of the Grand canyon o Arizona already in San Francisco and ready for use, work is progressing rapidly on the miniature of the canyon, which will be one of the most expensive and attractive concessions of the Panama-Pacific International exposition.

This concession, which is being con structed by the Santa Pe rallroad at a cost to exceed \$350,000, will be an exact replica of nature's masterpiece. While it will occupy only five and a half acres, scientific devices will show the canyon in its proper perspective and give the visitor a true conception of its great beights and distances

To make the resemblance between the canyon and the miniature as close as human ingenuity will permit, great quantities of rock and shrubbery are being brought to San Francisco from the canyon and will be used in the building of the concession. A large quantity of gray sandstone has been received from the canyon together with tree, mountain and desert sage, cactus and yucca.

A trainload of red sandatone from Winslow, Ariz., resembling the native stone of the canyon, has arrived and a ondiserable quantity already has been placed over the entrance of the Pueblo village, a concession also being installed by the Santa Fe adjoining the "Grand Canyon." The village will extend over the entire front of the Santa Fe's concession. Engraved in the stone opposite the main entrance to the village is the caption, "The Life of Vanishing Race.


