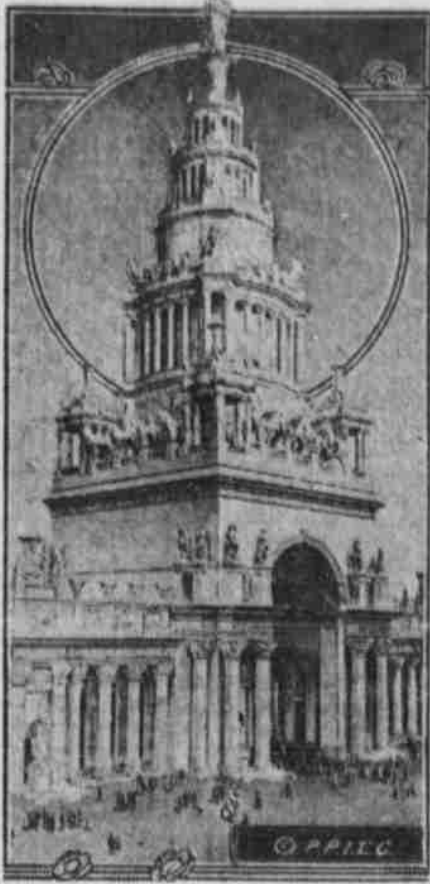

### TOWER GATEWAY TO PANAMA EXPOSITION



The dominating architectural feature of the exposition, the superb tower gateway, which will command the south entrance of the court of sun and stars. This tower, 89 feet in height, will have a base one acre in extent. The tower will rise upward in terraces, giving way at last to a group of figures supporting a globe, typifying the world. The repeated figures of armored horsemen and of explorers of the oceans will be used on the tower which, with its statuary, mural paintings and mosaics, will be indescribably beautiful. Messrs. Carrere and Hastings, architects-in-chief of the Pan-American exposition at Buffalo in 1901, are the architects.

### Marvel Concession Will Be Replica of the Grand Canyon

With large shipments of gray sandstone, mountain sage and cactus taken from the rim of the Grand canyon of Arizona already in San Francisco and ready for use, work is progressing rapidly on the miniature of the canyon, which will be one of the most expensive and attractive concessions of the Panama-Pacific International exposition.

This concession, which is being constructed by the Santa Fe railroad at a cost to exceed \$20,000, will be an exact replica of nature's masterpiece. While it will occupy only five and a half acres, scientific devices will show the visitor a true conception of its great heights and distances.

To make the resemblance between the canyon and the miniature as close as human ingenuity will permit, great quantities of rock and shrubbery are being brought to San Francisco from the canyon and will be used in the building of the concession. A large quantity of gray sandstone has been received from the canyon together with tree, mountain and desert sage, cactus and yucca.

A trainload of red sandstone from Winslow, Ariz., resembling the native stone of the canyon, has arrived and a considerable quantity already has been placed over the entrance of the Pueblo village, a concession also being installed by the Santa Fe adjoining the "Grand Canyon." The village will extend over the entire front of the Santa Fe's concession. Engraved in the stone opposite the main entrance to the village is the caption, "The Life of Vanishing Race."

**Novel Lighting Effects.**  
More than 14,000 prisms to be a part of the illuminating scheme of the Panama-Pacific International exposition have reached San Francisco from the Austrian manufacturers and more shipments are expected soon. A total of 125,000 prisms will be used. These will be suspended from the domes and facades of buildings and when the colored rays of powerful searchlights pass through them they will scintillate like precious stones.

### Dozen Striking Achievements of the Year 1913

January—Balzers' improvement upon the Hughes telegraph instrument, trebling its speed so that one may send or receive 1,500 words a minute.

February—The Lloyd's wireless operators in Cairo, Egypt, are in touch with Key West, Fla., more than 7,000 statute miles distant.

March—Perfection of an English process for converting iron ores of even the lowest grades into steel of excellent quality.

April—By use of a liquid microphone Prof. Vanni of Rome made possible wireless telephone communication between that city and Tripoli, 700 miles.

May—On the sixth of the month the two steam shovels working on the water level of the Panama canal met at Culebra cut.

June—British scientists announce that four elements, helium, neon, carbon and sulphur, have been procured from hydrogen through which an electric discharge had been passed.

July—Experiments at the University of Wisconsin perfect an electric thermometer to give warning of coming frost.

August—A process is announced from London whereby all fabrics may be treated so as to be made entirely waterproof, from flimsy silk to heaviest cloth.

September—A French monoplane aeronaut, Pegoud, demonstrates (July) his ability to fly backward as well as forward, and even upside down.

October—Launch of H. M. S. "Queen Elizabeth," the first oil-burning battleship of the world's navies.

November—Opening of the new water supply system of Los Angeles, 260,000,000 gallons now reaching the city daily through conduits 250 miles long.

December—"Trotol," a new high explosive, satisfactorily proved. Twice as powerful as dynamite, only a fulminate of mercury will explode it.

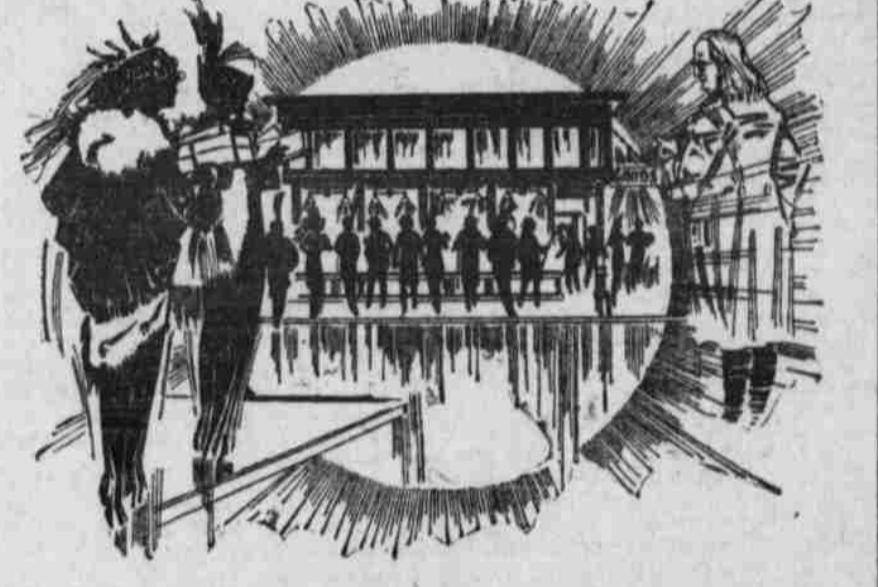
