

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Feb. B. A large half-starved gray wolf, after biting two persons, frightening a score of others and apreading consternation through a staid and fashionable south side residence district, was shot and killed on

Linwood boulevard here today. The wolf sprang upon Miss Anna Havrison as she waited for a street car. Miss Harrison screamed, threw her fur muff at the animal and while the muff was being torn to shreds escaped into a house. Her clothing was torn, but she was unhurt.
