BRYAN ORDERS FULL INQUIRY

All Information Received Will Be Given to British Government.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22.—Secretary Bryan has ordered a far-reaching investigation of the killing of William S. Benton, the British subject, at Juarez. He announced today that until all the facts in the case should be gathered from all available sources no opinion would be expressed by the State Department. All information received will be transmitted to the British government.

Explanations made by General Villa to Thomas D. Edwards and George C. Carothers, the American consular representatives at Juarez, together with the court martial record, are to be supplemented by further information. Instructions went forth to American Consul Letcher at Chihuahua to get additional details from General Villa, and it is understood that inquiry through independent sources will be carried on at Juarez. Mr. Carothers is consular agent at Torreon, temporarily assisting Mr. Edwards.

Advice received by the State department up to late today, giving General Villa's version of the affair, were that Benton was armed, had personally quarreled with General Villa, had been disarmed, tried by court martial and exe-

let that the undertaking by the American State department to look after the welfare of their people in Mexico would be sufficient to insure for them the degree of protection guaranteed by the rules of civilized warfare.

Closely following the news of the killing of Benton, under conditions which European diplomats are inclined to regard as violative of such rules, has come a report of the killing of two Spanish subjects in Mexico. The Spanish government, through its embassy here, requested information from the State department and so far this has not been available. Consequently there has been some discussion among diplomats of recommending a general withdrawal of Europeans from the disturbed country.

Wilson Policy Falters

The seriousness of the Mexican situation generally, and particularly the execution of Benton, furnished a subject of grave discussion with the senate while in executive session, after the arbitration treaties were disposed of. Members of the foreign relations committee gave assurances that they were in close touch with affairs, as directed by the president and state department. Official attention was called to the Benton case before the executive session began in a telegram to Senator Fall of New Mexico from R. M. Dudley, who asserted that General Villa had murdered Benton "like a dog," and that the American policy of "watchful waiting is a failure."

Senator Fall read this telegram again in the executive session and also read the senate resolutions of protest adopted last night at a mass meeting in El Paso, Tex. He urged a more aggressive policy by the American government and other senators who are inclined to be impatient over the present situation in Mexico sided with him.

northeast Nebraska have been in the grip of a genuine blizzard throughout the day. In Sioux City and vicinity the heaviest snow of the season is falling, with a high wind from the north, which is piling the flakes into drifts, hampering street and railroad traffic. Reports from South Dakota indicate a six-inch fall of snow. The Black Hills storm is without wind, but in the eastern half of the state a blizzard prevails, with the thermometer near the zero mark.

Drifts in Northwest Nebraska. CALLEWAY, Neb., Feb. 22.—(Special Telegram)—A fierce blizzard has been raging all day and is worse tonight. About eight inches of snow has fallen and is drifting badly. It is feared stock will suffer heavily.

Dakota Well Covered.

PIERRE, S. D., Feb. 22.—(Special Telegram)—The heaviest snow of the season fell here this afternoon, with more than six inches of snowfall, which drifted badly. Reports from the west as far as Rapid City show six inches or more of snow, but with little drifting.

From Colorado East.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 22.—A violent storm sweeping across the continent from Colorado tonight, according to the weather bureau, will cause rain tomorrow in the southern states and snow in the Mississippi and Ohio valleys, the lake regions and the north Atlantic states tomorrow and Tuesday.

"This disturbance," the bureau's bulletin said, "will be followed by a pronounced cold wave, which will over-spread the Mississippi valley, the southwestern states and the lake region Monday, and the eastern and southeastern
