R. Beecher Howell, general manager of the Metropolitan Water district, is of culating literature advocating municipal ownership of the Orbiha gas plant, which he undertakes to show would be 6.7 times as valuable to the city as the water plant

In his circular the Water board board cays that a comparison of the net carnings of the gas plant for the year 1911 and the water plant for 1913 shows that the water plant, not including depreciation and the taxes formerly paid, earned \$185,773.62 and the gas company carned \$296,071,56

Howell's municipal arguments and his table of comparative earnings, prepared on the supposition that the gas plant could be purchased for \$1,574,500, although On his return Mr. Mohler stopped at its assessed valuation is \$3,000,000, follow: Howell's Argument.

Howell's Argument.

The Omaha gas plant supplies gas to Omaha, South Omaha and Dundee. Recently the gas company has undertaken the supply of Benson.

The plant is bonded for \$2,500,900 and stocked for \$3,700,000, making a total capitalisation outstanding of \$8,250,000.

The United Gas improvement company of Philadelphia controls Omaha gas plant, as it holds about 70 per cent of the outstanding stock, amounting to \$2,622,900.

In 1912 the Omaha city council employed the late Prof. W. S. Marks of New York, an eminent gas expert, to determine the physical value of Omaha's gas plant. In a detail report filed with the council Prof. Marks found guch value to be \$1,440,000. To this he added \$125,000 for working capital making the total necessary investment, should the city have taken over the plant, at its value January 1, 1912, 15,74,200.

The city council also employed Marwick, Mitchell, Peat & Co., chartered accompany's books for the five-year period preceding January 1, 1912.

The report of these accountants has been used in preparing the following comparison of the income and profits of Omaha's water plant of the year 1913 with those of the gas plant for 1911, (In this comparison there is added to the value of both the water and gas plants \$125,00, for working capital);


