President Mohler Guest of Commercial Club at Hastings Banquet. SAYS SNOW IS OF GREAT VALUE

At this banquet Mr. Mohler was the chief speaker of the evening, discussing the development of railroads, railroad securities, railroad financing and the government ownership of railroads.

Mohler Principal Speaker. At the banquet covers were laid for 50, all representative business men of the city, and according to Mr. Mohler it was one of the most enjoyable banquets that he ever attended. It was 1 o'clock before good nights were said.

Talking with the business men of Hastings, Mr. Mohler found them most optimistic over the outlook for a good business year. They are all predicting a great wheat crop through Adams and neighboring counties and they can see no reason why land values should not increase materially this spring.

URGES CITY BUY GAS PLANT

R. Beecher Howell Cites Reasons with Array of Figures. COST ESTIMATES MADE LOW

Champion of Municipal Ownership Bases His Arguments Upon Minimum Purchase Price of the Establishment. R. Beecher Howell, general manager of the Metropolitan Water district, is circulating literature advocating municipal ownership of the Omaha gas plant, which he undertakes to show would be 6.7 times as valuable to the city as the water plant has been.

Howell's Argument. The Omaha gas plant supplies gas to Omaha, South Omaha and Council Bluffs. Recently the gas company has undertaken the supply of Benson. The plant is bonded for \$2,500,000 and stocked for \$2,700,000, making a total capitalization outstanding of \$5,200,000. The United Gas Improvement company of Philadelphia controls Omaha gas plant, as it holds about 70 per cent of the outstanding stock, amounting to \$2,625,000.
