British Government Considers Sending Suffragette to America.

HISTORIC CHURCH IS BURNED

Arahn Squad Destroys Building Near Dunbar, Scotland, Containing Relics of Oliver Cromwell and John Bull.

LONDON, Feb. 26.—Confirmation of the statement that no steps are being taken by the British government for the deportation of Miss Zelle Emerson, the militant suffragist of Jackson, Mich., was given by Reginald McKenna, home secretary, in a printed reply to a question put to him in the House of Commons today.

Mr. McKenna today had an audience with King George in connection with Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst's application for an interview with his majesty.

DUNBAR, Scotland, Feb. 26.—An arson squad of militant suffragettes today burned to the ground the historic parish church of the village of Whitekirk.

The church was erected in 1297 and contained many relics of the battle in which the Scots were routed by Oliver Cromwell's forces in 1650.
