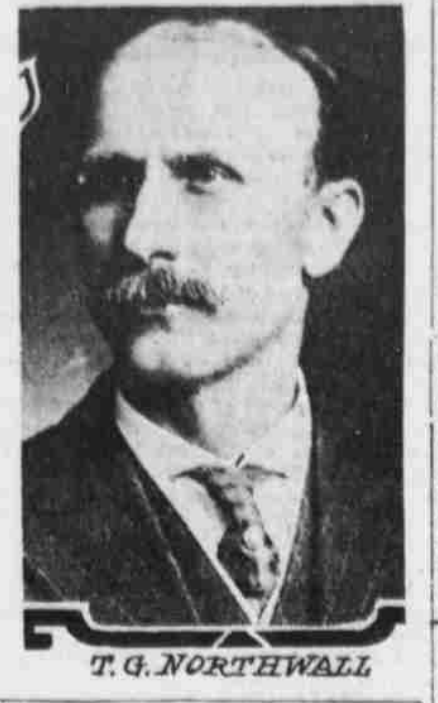

GARD HAULS STOLEN CORN

Conveys Cereal with His Team from Boxcar to Mill.

GRAVENHURST IS DISCHARGED

Because Commissioner Daniel Places Little Reliance in Teamster's Testimony—Craig Held for Grand Jury.

J. D. Gravenhurst, charged with stealing corn from a car in the Missouri Pacific yards here, was discharged by Herbert S. Daniel, United States commissioner, yesterday afternoon, when the only witness connecting Gravenhurst with the crime, was David Gard, who admitted on the witness stand that with his team and wagon he hauled several loads of the stolen corn from the boxcar to the mill where it was sold.

Gravenhurst had been in the employ of the Missouri Pacific for fourteen years and at the time the robbery occurred, he was foreman of the switching crew in the Missouri Pacific yards. Gravenhurst, it was charged, changed the tags on the car of corn, and had it switched to a convenient siding, where the men could bring their wagons and load them with corn.

George Craig, who was formerly in the employ of the Missouri Pacific and was also charged with stealing corn from a car in interstate commerce, was bound over to the federal grand jury on a bond of \$1,500.

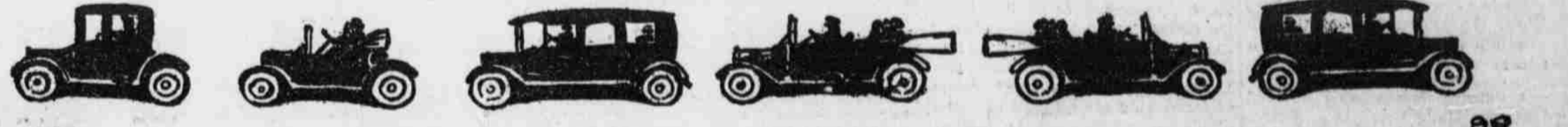
