### WILSON CARRIES NEW YORK STATE BY LARGE MARGIN

#### Gains Plurality Over Roosevelt in Metropolis of One Hundred Thousand Votes.

#### TAFT LEADS T. R. IN STATE

#### President Runs Close to Democrat Outside Biggest City.

#### SULZER LEADS FOR GOVERNOR

#### Hedges Also Leads Straus, Progressive, by Large Vote.

#### FORTY-FIVE DEMO ELECTORS

#### Results in Empire State Give Wilson Overwhelming Lead in Electoral College in Presidential Election.

Early returns from yesterday's election point to the victory of the democratic candidates by virtue of a landslide, which may be charged solely to a divided republican party.

States hitherto reliable in the support of republican candidates have split their vote between Taft and Roosevelt to the extent that Wilson is given a plurality sufficiently large to secure him the electoral vote.

At the hour of this writing it is too soon to give more than estimates of pluralities, but it is conceded that Wilson will have at least 150,000 plurality in New York; in Illinois Wilson men claim the state by 100,000; Maine will give Wilson a slight plurality; Massachusetts apparently is for Taft; Connecticut and New Jersey are for Wilson; the south has gone solidly for the democratic ticket.

Returns from western states are too few to give a mention of how they are going to vote.

### STATE OF ILLINOIS GOES TO ROOSEVELT

#### State Goes Strong for Colonel, but Cook County Vote Appears to Be Very Close.

#### TAFT RUNNING A CLOSE THIRD Combined Anti-Roosevelt Ballots Outnumber Those for T. R.

#### DENEEN BEATEN FOR GOVERNOR

#### Dunne, Democratic Candidate, Without Doubt is Elected.

#### FUNK HAS NO CHANCE AT ALL

#### Progressive Candidate for Governor of Illinois Third in Voting, with Less Than Half of Republican Vote.

**CHICAGO, Nov. 5.**—"It seems to be unanimously conceded that Governor Wilson's election is assured," Joseph B. Davies, manager of the democratic campaign in the west, said at 5 o'clock tonight. "Now it is rather a question of what states will not be for Wilson instead of what states are for him. Illinois promises to be close, but from the returns at this time I am not prepared to concede the state to Colonel Roosevelt."

Returns from 222 precincts out of 2,785 in Illinois, outside of Cook county, give: Taft, 13,378; Wilson, 17,730; Roosevelt, 26,548. The same precincts in 1908 gave: Taft, 30,364; Bryan, 20,243.

Returns from thirteen counties outside of Cook indicated Dunne had carried nine, Funk three and Deneen one. Dunne continued to lead in Cook county, 449 precincts giving him 83,654; Deneen, 33,009; Funk, 26,354.

**CHICAGO, Nov. 5.**—Indications at 7:30 p. m. are that Roosevelt will carry the state outside of Cook county by 90,000 plurality if the returns continue in the present ratio.

### TAFT VOTES IN CINCINNATI

#### President Cheered as He Drives to Polling Place.

#### STRAIGHT TICKET FOR WILSON

#### Candidate Says He Has a Hard Time Finding the Democratic Electors — Roosevelt Casts His Ballot.

**CINCINNATI, Nov. 5.**—President Taft took the full allotted five minutes when he voted shortly after noon. He voted each of the six separate ballots, five of which are devoted to local affairs. Before visiting the polling booth, the president visited with a number of Cincinnati friends, including Congressman Nicholas Longworth, son-in-law of Colonel Roosevelt. President Taft was cheered by a number as he drove through the streets on his way to vote.

**Wilson Votes Straight Ticket.** — **PRINCETON, N. J., Nov. 5.**—Governor Woodrow Wilson voted the straight democratic ticket at 10:15 o'clock in the interior of an engine house. He was in the voting booth four minutes and remarked as he came out that the ballot was so big he "had a hard time finding the democratic presidential electors."

When the nominee arrived at the polling place he was greeted by a group of photographers and spectators.

A half dozen photographers had perched their cameras in the interior of the little engine house.

### FEW STRAIGHT TICKETS IN IOWA ELECTION

**DES MOINES, Ia., Nov. 5.**—Special Telegram.—Because very few straight tickets were voted in the state election judges were slow in making reports on today's balloting, and the fact that tickets contained five full party lists and all state and local officers were to be filled made the count of the vote slow.

The surprise of the day, at least in the cities, was the rapidity of the voting, as ballots were cast at least on the machines much faster than at other elections.

In the city for the first time many women appeared to take part in the campaign.

### CONSPIRACY TO ROB NAVY

#### Extensive Plot to Steal Old Brass and Copper Uncovered.

#### ONE CARLOAD OF LOOT IS SEIZED

#### Fifty Thousand Pounds of Old Metal Taken from Mare Island Yard is Recovered Near City of Chicago.

**CHICAGO, Nov. 5.**—A carload of naval supplies said by the police to have been stolen from the Mare Island navy yard at San Francisco, valued at about \$5,000, was seized by federal authorities in the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy railroad yards near Hawthorne, Ill. today.

The supplies were taken on a writ issued by United States Judge Kenesaw M. Landis. The car was billed to a smelting and refining company with a plant here.

Government investigators said there had existed a band of thieves which has been robbing United States naval yards of supplies aggregating several hundred thousands of dollars.

The government agents have been working for several months attempting to locate shipments of stolen materials. It is believed that today's discovery will result in disclosing further cases. The carload consisted of more than 50,000 pounds of copper and brass used in the construction of battleships.

The car was consigned to the smelting and refining company by a San Francisco agent. It left San Francisco October 19 and arrived in the Hawthorne yards last Sunday. Federal officers ordered the railroad company to hold the car until court action could be taken.
