DEMOCRATS SWEEP PLATTEA

Little Probability Count Will Be Finished Before Late Today.

COUNTY TICKET WITH THE RES.

Election Phenomenal for Its Lack of Excitement and for Small Interest Displayed Except in Marking of the Ballots.

With but little probability of the count of the ballots cast Tuesday in city and county being completed before late today enough returns were received before 11 o'clock last night to indicate that Wilson had carried the county, bearing to victory with him the greater part of the state and county democratic ticket.

Vote in Townships. Hancock township gave Wilson, 191; Taft, thirty-six; and Roosevelt, eighty-six.

LITTLE EXCITEMENT IN IOWA

Interest Centers Mostly on State and County Tickets.

RELIGIOUS QUESTION AN ISSUE

Five Catholic Candidates in Polk County Precipitate Fight in Des Moines, but Has No Effect in State.

DES MOINES, Nov. 6.—(Special.)—Aside from the fact that the day was orderly and quiet and the voting early and strong the feature in the capital city today was the fact that practically all the activity was by and on behalf of local candidates.

The fight was complicated by the fact of the third party ticket actively in the field and because several of the republican candidates have incurred the enmity of their own party.

There was excitement at the county court house today when George L. Dobson, county treasurer, failed to show up at his office.

It is expected that Des Moines business men will arrange a banquet for Governor Herbert E. Hadley of Missouri next Saturday.

An accusation of attempt at extorting blackmail has been made against one C. E. Osborne of West Liberty, and he will be arraigned in federal court at Cedar Rapids.

Last year \$2,562.25 was paid by the counties of the state as bounty on rattlesnakes. This is the largest sum which has been paid in some years.

Now that the political campaign is at an end the office of attorney general is preparing to resume prosecution of indicted county officials in several places, and to continue the probe into conditions elsewhere.

The transfer companies, employing several hundred teamsters in Des Moines, have taken steps which seem to indicate a desire to prolong the strike and cause further delay in settlement.

State Superintendent A. M. Deyoe will in his biennial report urge some changes in the taxation system of the state with a view to a better distribution of the taxes derived from corporations.

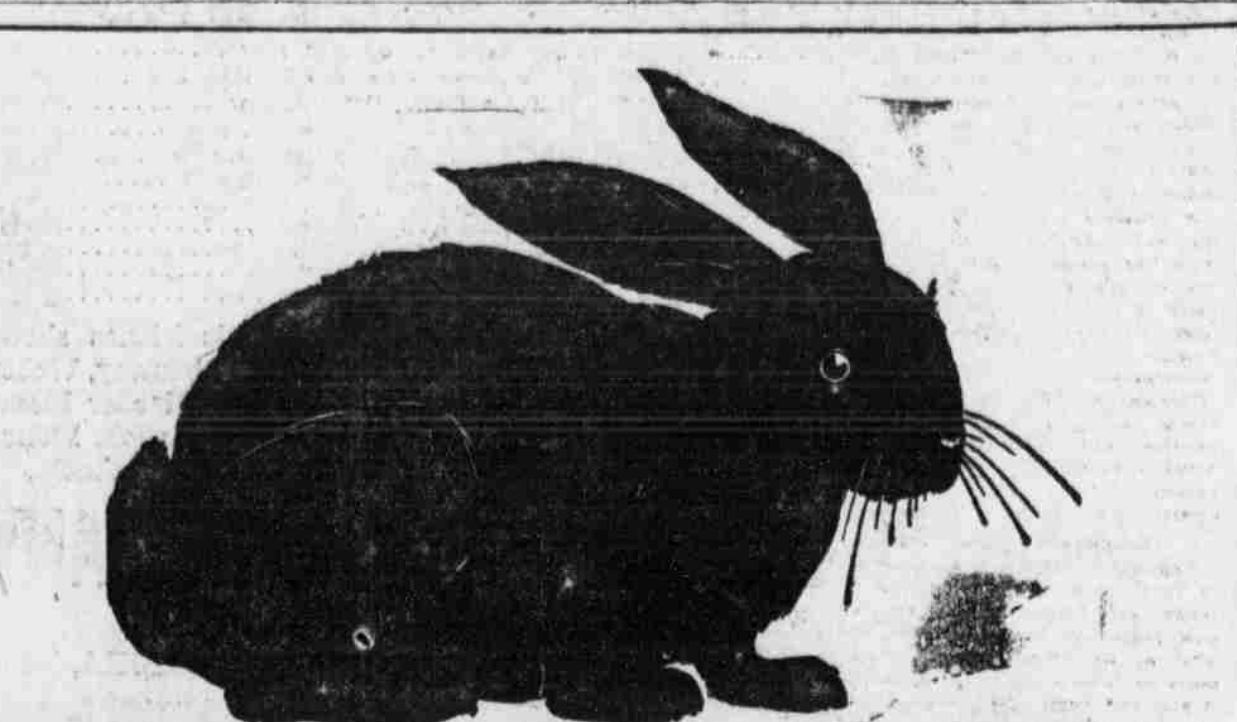
