COST OF GROCERIES IS DOWN

Sugar Prices Reduced and May Go Still Lower by Next Week. FRUITS ARE NOW MUCH CHEAPER Eggs Remain Firm, but a Drop is Expected to Follow When the Storage Houses of the Country Are Filled. Sugar has declined in price during the last few days until conscientious grocers are offering it at nineteen pounds for 95 cents, and those who know say it will be selling at twenty pounds for a dollar next week. A. King, manager of Hayden Bros' grocery department, says the American Sugar Refining company, chief manipulator of sugar prices, is becoming

dubious about maintaining the higher marks since the election. Dried fruits also are falling in price. Dried apples are priced at 12 1/2 cents a pound, dried California prunes at from 7 to 10 cents a pound, dried currants at 12 1/2 cents and dried peaches at 7 1/2 cents. Currants, figs and dates are remaining firm because of the Balkan war, the seat of which is the native country of these fruits. Dried raspberries, which also are handled by American evaporators, are 35 per cent less in price than at this time a year ago. Rice is some cheaper at four pounds for 25 cents. Home grown vegetables have gone. Tomatoes from California are on the local market at 1 1/2 cents a pound. All kinds of nuts are higher, especially walnuts, which are selling wholesale at 16 cents a pound. Eggs remain the same in price, while butter has increased 2 cents, selling now at 36 cents a pound. Eggs are expected to become cheaper, as the storage houses are filled with them and must be relieved before more are produced. Apples of all kinds are much cheaper than at this time a year ago. Jonathan and other kinds that sold for \$2.25 a box last year are retailed now at \$1.25 a box.

Sunday Recipes

- Plum Charlotte. Stone one quart of ripe plums, first stem and then sweeten them. Cut slices of bread and butter and lay them in the bottom of large broiler dish. Pour in the plums, boiling hot, cover the bowl and set away to cool gradually. To be eaten quite cold with cream.
Canneton of Beef. Two pounds lean beef cut from the round, one-half teaspoonful grated lemon rind, one-quarter teaspoonful ground nutmeg, one teaspoonful salt, one-quarter teaspoonful pepper, one egg, one-half teaspoonful onion juice, two tablespoonfuls melted butter and one tablespoonful finely chopped parsley. Grind the beef and mix well with the other ingredients. Shape in a roll about six inches in length, place on a rack in dripping pan, sear and bake in a slow oven thirty minutes. Baste every five minutes, first with water and later with dripping. Serve with brown mushroom sauce.
Fish Chowder. Three pounds of cod or halibut, or any other firm white fish, eight potatoes sliced and parboiled, one large sliced onion, one-half pound fat salt pork, cut into dice, two cupfuls of boiling milk with a pinch of soda stirred in, six Boston crackers split and buttered thickly, chopped parsley, pepper and salt to taste; one lemon, pared, cut into thin slices; celery. Fry the pork in its own fat, add the onion and when they are brown drain the fat. Put a layer of potatoes in the soup pot, then add one of potatoes peppered; next fish, onions, more pork and so on. Pour in a glassful of claret, then just enough boiling water to cover all. Stew gently half an hour. Line the tureen with buttered crackers, pour on the boiling milk and set the tureen in boiling water until the chowder is done. Just before taking it up add the parsley. Boil one minute and pour.
Tommy Green Pepper Salad. One fourth cup French dressing, three medium sized tomatoes, one small green sweet pepper, one bunch head lettuce will be needed for this recipe. Select firm tomatoes, peel and slice. Remove the seeds from a fresh green pepper and slice the pod in very thin strips with a paring knife. Rub a small salad bowl with a bit of onion and line with crisp lettuce leaves. Arrange a layer of sliced tomatoes upon the lettuce and sprinkle with the sliced green peppers, then another layer of the tomatoes and the remainder of the green peppers. Pour the dressing over all.
Strained Corn Bread. Mix two cupfuls of corn meal with a scant cupful of flour, a little salt and a teaspoonful of soda. Add to this one cupful granulated corn meal, three cupfuls of flour. Dissolve a yeast cake in water, add the remaining ingredients and mix thoroughly. Let rise, shape, let rise again and bake as entire wheat bread.
Apples on Casserole. Cut the apples in quarters, then put in a buttered casserole and cook until you can pierce them. Then take out and sprinkle as much sugar over them as you like, which will melt and run through the hot apple.
Oyster Bouillon. One pint of oysters mixed fine and their liquor. Cook five minutes, then add one pint of water, one-half teaspoonful of celery salt, one-quarter teaspoonful of salt and a blade of mace. When boiling strain through a cloth and serve in cups, adding a little whipped cream or a tiny piece of butter to each cup.
Veal Loaf. Boil three pounds of veal until tender. Also boil three eggs hard. Grind these well and season highly with red pepper, celery salt and table salt. Lastly, dissolve one teaspoonful of gelatin in a little cold water, adding two cups of boiling water. Pour this over the meat, eggs and seasoning. Mold into shape desired and put in the refrigerator.
Plum Conserves. Wash three pounds of plums, remove pits, add three pounds of sugar and cook until thick, add one pound seeded raisins and one pound pecan nut meats broken in small pieces, cook twenty minutes. Grate the rind of three oranges and two lemons, add the pulp and cook eight or ten minutes. Fill jelly glasses and cover with paraffin.
Chicken Pie. Divide a chicken in pieces for serving. Melt four tablespoonfuls of butter in a saucepan, add one-quarter cupful chopped onion, sprig of parsley, bay leaf, four cloves and one tablespoonful of salt. Place in chicken and cover with boiling water; cook till tender. Arrange chicken in baking dish; cover with strained and thickened stock. Place a pastry crust on top and bake in hot oven until crust is ready.
Cold Slaw. Put a teaspoonful of melted butter in a stewpan and add to it a teaspoonful of flour. Mix, then put in a half teaspoonful of vinegar. Beat an egg and add to it a teaspoonful each of mustard, sugar, salt and a half teaspoonful of pepper. Beat all together and stir in the boiling vinegar; boil one minute. Pour over chopped cabbage, toss and chill before serving.
Coddled Apples. Take four large sour apples, one-third cupful of sugar and two cupfuls of water. Pare and core the apples. Place in a saucepan large enough so the apples sit on the bottom. Add the water with the sugar dissolved. Cover tightly and turn the apples so that they will cook evenly. When tender remove to individual plates and pour liquid over them. Place a tablespoonful of sweetened whipped cream on top of each.
New England Clam Chowder. Take one quart of clams. Separate the belly from the other part and out off the black head. Have ready some fried pork scraps, some split crackers, sliced raw potatoes and onions. Put a layer of clams, a layer of crackers, a layer of potatoes and onions, with pepper and salt on each layer. Cover with hot water and boil until the potatoes are done. Then add two quarts of milk.
