POLICE KEEPS CLOSE WATCH FOR WOMAN AND CHILD

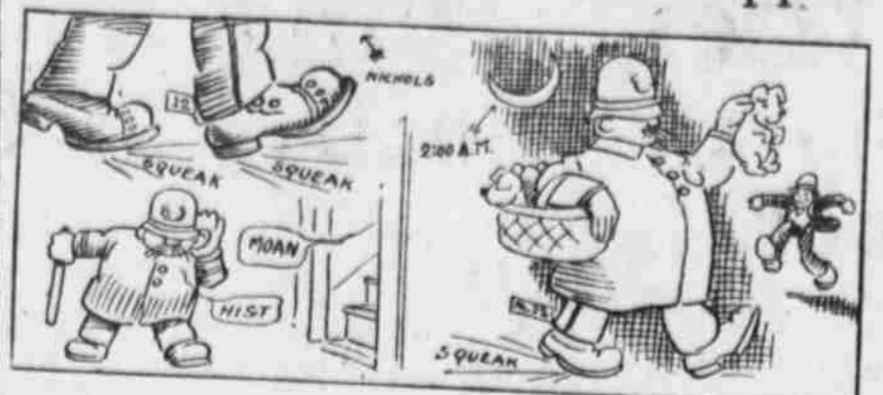
Information that a mulatto woman with a 4-year-old white child is on her way to Omaha from Baton Rouge, La., caused a ripple of excitement at police headquarters last night.
