Wharton Prepares Omaha Postoffice for Parcels Post

Postmaster John C. Wharton is pre paring for the purcels post which goes into effect on January I. He is making an exhaustive study of the new order and will be one of the best versed men on the proposition in the country when it is put into effect. He has received a huge map, which is divided into eight zones, circling from Omaha. zone includes Omaha and the 'territory within a fifty mile radius. The second zone takes in 150 miles around Omaha, the third zone 300, the fourth 500, the fifth 1.000 and down to the eighth zone. The rates of postage per pound under the parcels post from Omaha to any point in the first zone will be five cents, the second zone seven cents, the third zone eight cents, and up to the eight zone
