DANIEL H. WHEELER IS DEAD

Pioneer of Nebraska Expires at His Home in Omaha.

LIVED IN STATE SINCE 1856

Former Mayor of Plattsmouth, Held Offices in Legislature and Served Term as Councilman in Omaha.

After a month's illness with paralysis, Daniel H. Wheeler died shortly before 12 o'clock last night at his home, 509 South Twenty-sixth avenue.

Funeral services will be conducted at All Saints church Saturday morning at 10 o'clock by the rector, T. J. Mackay, D. D. The body will be taken to Plattsmouth for burial in the afternoon.

Mr. Wheeler was born in Flowerfield, St. Joseph county, Michigan, in 1834. When only 22 years of age he came to Nebraska.

During his term of office as mayor Mr. Wheeler was appointed to the State Board of Agriculture, which office he held for about fifteen years.

Rev. Dr. Williams Delivers Sermon at United Presbyterian Church.

SPEAKS OF BALKAN STRUGGLE

Says that While War Presents Disappointing Aspects It Will Work Toward Removing Cesspool of the World.

There never was a time when the words of Jesus were taken more seriously than they are today, declared Rev. Milton B. Williams in a Thanksgiving sermon at the United Presbyterian church.

He preached on "The God of Fair Play," the expression of whose will, he said, is to be seen in all the great progressive moves of history.

Rev. Williams had for his hearers members of the congregations of the First Presbyterian, First Methodist, First Congregational, Parkway Presbyterian and Central United Presbyterian churches.

"We are inclined to think on Thanksgiving day," he said, "of bank balances, stock reports and the like, and while it is all right to connect them with God, it is a greater sight to look at the heart of the world's moral. Above all there reigns the sway of the God of fair play."

Rev. Williams spoke of the conflict between the allies and Turkey and said that while the war presents disappointing aspects from the standpoint of world peace it will mean a movement toward the removal of "the plague spot, the cesspool" of the world.

A collection of nearly \$50 was taken at the church for the Old People's Home.

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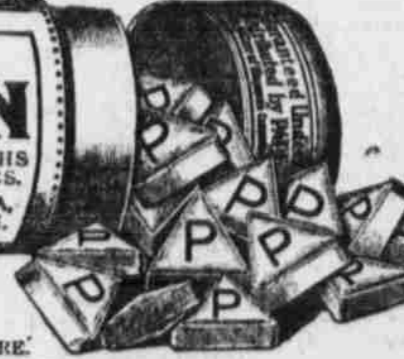

Rev. McGiffin spoke on the spirit of Thanksgiving

"Ingratitude," he said, "is the traitor of the soul. It will be a very sorry time in the life of any individual that individual fails to have the proper spirit of gratitude toward benefactors. The spirit of God is dead in such an individual. It is a sorry time when children fail to feel the proper spirit of gratitude toward their parent for what they owe to them for the care and attention they have received. Such children do not as a rule make the best citizens, because the traitor has entered their soul. If this is true of the attitude of children toward parents, how much more true is it of the attitude of persons toward their God."
