Many Interested in Parcels Post. Circulars sent out early in the month by Postmaster Wharton in regard to parcels post are bringing hundreds of replies and estimates from those to whom they have been sent. The object of the circulars was to make the public in general thoroughly acquainted with the methods and charges of the parcels post, and to obtain an idea from the business houses as to the amount of matter they would send by this method during the coming year, also whether the mailing is to be local or foreign. Judging from the countless replies, a great deal of interest is being taken in parcels post.

OMAHA LEADS DISTRICT IN RECRUITS ACCEPTED. Out of nine marine recruiting substations in what is known as the Missouri district, comprising the state of Nebraska, Missouri, Kansas and Iowa, the station located in Omaha accepted the largest number of recruits during the month of December. It accepted ten out of forty applicants. The stations are limited in the number they may accept during any one month, and the examinations are made very rigid, as the marine corps is usually full, so that few recruits are accepted. At present, however, the marine corps is 225 men short of the quota allowed by congress, as congress increased the force by 600 men at the last session. Of these 600, already 318 have been made up in the various recruiting stations.

MOHLER TALKS ON THE MERGER. Says He Does Not Think It Will Have Bearing on Union Pacific. When told that the United States supreme court had dissolved the merger of the Union and Southern Pacific roads, President Mohler of the Union Pacific said: "Not having seen the full text of the decision, I am not prepared to discuss the matter, or express an opinion as to the ultimate outcome. In fact, there is nobody here who would know anything about what will be done. That is a matter that will be disposed of in New York by the members of the executive boards of the Pacific roads. "I don't see what bearing the matter could have upon the Union Pacific, as it has been acting wholly within the provisions of law and there has been no attempt, or desire to violate the Sherman anti-trust or any other laws. If there is to be any change in policy, or readjustment of matters, I have not been advised as to the plans."

LOOMIS HAS NOTHING TO SAY. General Solicitor of Union Pacific Declines to Talk. "I have nothing, whatever, to say," said N. H. Loomis, general solicitor of the Union Pacific, when advised of the decision; "there is nothing I could say with propriety."

Railroad Station Robbed by Holdups. SALT LAKE CITY, Dec. 1.—Two masked highwaymen, armed with revolvers, entered the Bamberger route station here late tonight, compelled the ticket agent to open the safe and robbed it of about \$200. The robbers then bid their victim "good night" and escaped. There were no passengers in the depot at the time of the robbery.

RECORD OF THE MERGER CASE

Roads Sought Not Monopoly, but a Through Line to San Francisco. DENY THEY WERE COMPETITORS. Expend Nearly \$400,000,000 in Betterments Since 1901. Going to Show They Did Not Intend to Stifle Competition. The Union Pacific had associated with it as the appellee in the merger case just won by the government, the other component parts, of the so-called Harriman system, the Southern Pacific, Oregon Short Line and Oregon Railroad & Navigation company, now the Oregon & Washington Railroad & Navigation company. The railroads won the suit in the United States circuit court for the district of Utah, which was heard at St. Paul before Judge Walter H. Sanborn and had high hopes of securing a confirmation before the United States supreme court. N. H. Loomis, general solicitor for the Union Pacific, in his argument in behalf of the appellees, epitomized the railroad's side of the case in these words: "The object which the Union Pacific had in view in acquiring an interest in the Southern Pacific was not to suppress competition or to obtain a monopoly, but to secure a permanent relationship with the Southern Pacific which would insure for it a perpetual through line to San Francisco, as contemplated by the act and give to it as well an entrance into all the traffic producing centers of California."

Not Competing Lines. The railroads denied that the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific were competing lines, basing their contention primarily on the point that the Southern Pacific not only operated, but controlled the broken water and rail route from New York to San Francisco and also the rail line from San Francisco to Ogden, the essential part of the all-rail through route from New York to San Francisco and the only line over which the Union Pacific could send its California business.

This complication comes about through an amendment to the association's constitution adopted at the last meeting. That amendment provided that the president should be elected by a referendum vote taken by ballot through the mail at the time the members ballot on the location of the next association meeting. Association Custom. According to the custom of the association the executive committee does not meet until January. At their meeting then in 1914 after the next meeting of the association they are to take the names of the five receiving the greatest number of votes for the nomination for president and send them out on a ballot to the teachers to be voted upon. This will be a month after the term of President Delzell shall have expired. The teachers are given a reasonable length of time in which to vote and mail their choice back to the executive committee. Then the executive committee must meet to canvass the vote. POOL HALLS ARE CRIME BEDS. Proprietor is Given Rebuke for Encouraging Minors. JUDGE ASSESSES SEVERE FINE. F. B. Riley's Place is Raided by Mogy Bernstein, but Most of the Minor Frequenters Make Their Escape. "Pool halls are the worst breeders of crime and in them can be found the very worst characters for boys to associate with. Instead of loafing in the pool halls the boys should be at home and I am going to see that they are kept there if I have to close every pool hall in the city of Omaha." The above rebuke was handed out to F. B. Riley, proprietor of a pool hall at 342 Cuming street, by Judge Foster, as he fined the former \$50 and costs in police court. Riley appealed the case. Riley's pool room was raided by the police at the instance of Mogy Bernstein Sunday night. By the time the police had arrived in response to Bernstein's telephone message that minors were playing pool, three boys had slipped out a rear entrance. Three boys were arrested, including Thor Lauritzen, 911 North Twenty-fifth avenue, who told the police he was but 16 years of age. Bernstein appeared against Riley in police court, as did three patrolmen. Judge Foster said he had no sympathy for pool hall proprietors who persisted in conducting their business for the benefit of minors. He declared he would instruct the police to search for proprietors of a pool room in Omaha in which boys under 18 years of age were allowed to enter. He said the city ordinance not only forbids minors playing pool, but also prohibits them from even frequenting such places.

Woods in writing to Canada was taking advantage of one of the prison privileges accorded to prisoners on holidays. He expresses the hope that some day he will be freed by reason of good conduct and adds that if he is given his freedom he will thereafter be a good citizen. At this time Woods is in charge of the prison butcher shop and is cutting up and handling 1,000 pounds of meat per day. During his spare time, he says he is studying geology, mine engineering and Spanish. With the Leavenworth prisoners Thanksgiving was a holiday and during the afternoon, all who were on their good behavior, permitted to attend a vaudeville entertainment, the performers all being prisoners, who on the program were designated, not by their names, but by their prison numbers.
