AURORA, Neb., Dec. 25.—(Special Telegram.)—Announcement is made by the Aurora Republican this week of the organization of a stock company known as the Aurora Printing Company, composed of Clark Perkins, James Schoenover and C. A. Carlson, which will take over the plant, business and good will of the paper and continue the enterprise upon somewhat more extensive lines. The Republican has been owned and managed during the last year by Clark Perkins, formerly secretary of the State Railway commission, while Messrs. Schoenover and Carlson were connected with the paper for several years prior to his purchase.

INDIAN SLAYER OF ROBBER CONGRATULATED BY JURORS

SAN BERNARDINO, Cal., Dec. 25.—A coroner's jury that investigated today the killing in Needles of Aniceto Londerer not only exonerated his slayer, Jon Bishop, a Mojave Indian, but congratulated him and took up a subscription to buy him a brace of new revolvers, so he could help rid the desert city of a gang of thugs that has terrorized it for weeks. Bishop interrupted Londerer while the latter and two companions were committing a robbery. He dropped Londerer in his tracks and wounded the second highwayman, who managed to escape with the aid of a third member of the gang. The coroner recommended that Bishop be retained as a member of the police force.


