CHICAGO, May 28.—Chicago defeated St. Louis, 4 to 3, today, but required sixteen innings to do it. The game was tied three times.

The winning run was driven in by Sweeney. Saler drew a base on balls in the sixteenth and Phelan sacrificed him to second. Schultz went out, but Sweeney singled and scored.

Brennahan was hit by a foul tip on the wrist and had to retire from the game. Score: St. Louis, 3; Chicago, 4.

OUIMET WINS FRENCH TITLE

American Open Golf Champion Takes Another Honor.

EASY VICTORY OVER TOPPING

Champion is Four Up at End of the First Eighteen Holes and Four Up and Three to Play at the Finish.

VERSAILLES, May 28.—Francis Ouimet, American open golf champion, became amateur champion of France today by defeating Henry J. Topping of the Greenwich club, Connecticut, by four up and three to play in the final round of thirty-six holes.

At the end of the first eighteen holes of the thirty-six-hole final for the French golf championship today Francis Ouimet was one up at the end of the first nine.

Topping drove a longer ball when he hit it cleanly, but he made mistakes with some of his wooden club shots through the greens. He did not keep so good a line as Ouimet and several times was off the course.
