CHICKENS ARE DOWN A LITTLE

Barnyard Pheasants Slump Five Cents a Pound Over a Good Many Retall Counters Since Last Week.

Meat high and garden produce abundant and cheap, is in a nutshell the market condition in the grocery and produce For a while radishes, both red and the long white variety, can be had eight bunches for a nickel. Veal and lamb chops are so high that people are actually holding off and refusing to buy them to a large extent. While cabbage can be had at 24 cents a pound and onlons are tossed out in generous bunches for a nickel, and while red beets are 4 cents a bunch, smoked meats are climbing higher and higher with the approach of the warm weather.

Yet there is a little relief in the meat market this year. During the last few days the heavy grades of beef have come down a little. The heavy cornfed stock is still coming to the market and a decline of about \$1 a hundred wholesale has been witnessed on the heavy beef.

Again, while iarobs have gone so high that even the packers don't like to buy them on the hoof and the consumers can scarcely afford to buy them for the table, possible to turn to chicken with iome promise of relief. For chickens are down fully a nickel retail since a week ago. In some of the retail stores handling large quantities, they are being sold even more than a nickel below what they were a few weeks ago. Hens that brought 30 cents a pound a week ago, can now be had quite readily for 1614 cents.

Spring chickens are on the market in limited quantities. They are held to the stiff price of around 45 cents a pound. The price is almost prohibitive and the demand for this reason is very limited. Large green cucumbers are on the market at prices ranging from 5 to 71/2 and 16 cents apiece. Ripe tomatoes are still reigning at 10 cents a pound, for there are as yet no home grown ones. The supply is scant even at that price
