Exteriors of Fair Buildings Are All Nearly Completed

Everyone who visits the Panama-Pacific International exposition grounds at San Francisco these days is greatly surprised at the advanced stage of the construction work. Although there is much interior finishing yet to be done, so many of the huge and beautiful exteriors have been completed that the beholder can today gain a very fair idea of the magnificent grandeur of the perfected project.

To date, thirty-five foreign nations and thirty-eight American states and territories have arranged to occupy space at the exposition. Even far off Sam will be represented, and Prince Kajani will be commissioner. Other royal visitors will be King Ferdinand, Queen Eleanora and Crown Princess Boris of Bulgaria, and King Alfonso and Queen Victoria of Spain.

A significant indication of the strong religious activity prevalent in the United States is the fact that the two great branches of the American Christian church will each have a costly display. The Roman Catholics will exhibit a magnificent reproduction of St. Peter's at Rome, while the Protestant denominations are planning to erect a unique building in the form of a huge open Bible.

The Union Pacific Railway company, one of the principal and most convenient transcontinental lines which will carry visitors to the exposition next year, has started work on its magnificent and realistic reproduction of the Yellowstone National park, one of America's scenic show places.

Some conception of the number of people who will visit this epoch-making exposition can be gathered by the fact that it is estimated that no less than 500 society conventions will be held at San Francisco (for which a special convention hall has been built), during 1915. One of the most important and interesting of these will be the First International Engineering Congress, to be presided over by Colonel Goethals, builder of the Panama canal.

One hundred thousand dollars has been appropriated to bring the first world polo tournament to San Francisco in 1915. It will be conducted under the auspices of the American Polo association, and will last from March 15 to May 1.

Venezuela Active at the Exposition

Venezuela takes a neighborly interest in the completion of the Panama canal and not only has she accepted Uncle Sam's invitation to his world party to celebrate the canal opening but she has sent a commissioner to reserve a place on the grounds of the Panama-Pacific International exposition at San Francisco. The dedications of national and state sites are accompanied by attractive ceremonies and when the Venezuelan site was officially delivered to Commissioner Octavia Escobar Vargas, his wife, Senora Vargas, pulled the flag of Venezuela to the flag pole staff while the military bands played the southern republic's national anthem. The exposition is doing its share toward making the Monroe doctrine mean something along with the fifteen-inch guns that proclaim it.

LARGE BALL ROOM IN STATE OF CALIFORNIA PAVILION

The best building for the visitors at the Panama-Pacific International exposition will be the California state building and the ground for this structure has been broken. Governor Hiram Johnson was one of the speakers. Californians declare they will have the finest pavilion ever erected by any state or nation in any exposition and the announcement that the building and all its contents will represent an outlay of \$3,000,000, looks as if they were correct. They promise a ball room, larger and more lavishly furnished than any ball room now found in the state of California and that is a real promise.

Dog Show at Exposition. The Panama-Pacific International exposition is not to overlook the dog. He will be given three days and announcement has just been made that the exposition dog show on November 16, 17 and 18 will carry away \$3,568 in prizes.

Battleship Oregon to Carry President to Big Frisco Fair

That the fleet of warships that will assemble at Hampton Roads early in the year 1915 and steam through the Panama canal headed by the historic Oregon, with President Wilson on board, will be the largest ever assembled, is made certain by the first report of the United States navy department. The officials of the Panama-Pacific International exposition have been notified by the navy department that eleven foreign nations have accepted the invitation to send ships. The list now includes Austria, Russia, Japan, Germany, France, England, Argentina Republic, Greece, Spain, England and Portugal. Assistant Secretary of the Navy Franklin D. Roosevelt said on a recent visit to San Francisco that the United States navy would have more than fifty-five ships in line. The great war fleet will be an unprecedented feature during the time of the exposition.

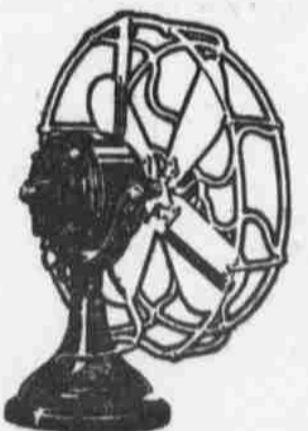

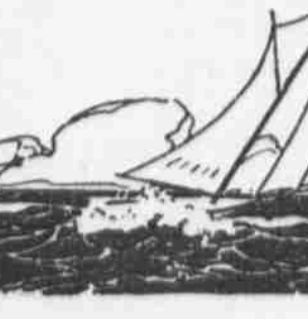
