Abbott, together with the Board of Commissioners, ex-Governor Holcomb, Judge Kennedy of Omaha and Henry Gerdes of Falls City, have given the association a cordial invitation to hold its meetings at the school. It is believed that the meeting will be the largest gathering of the sightless ever held in the state since the work was organized eight years ago.

Home Products Campaign.

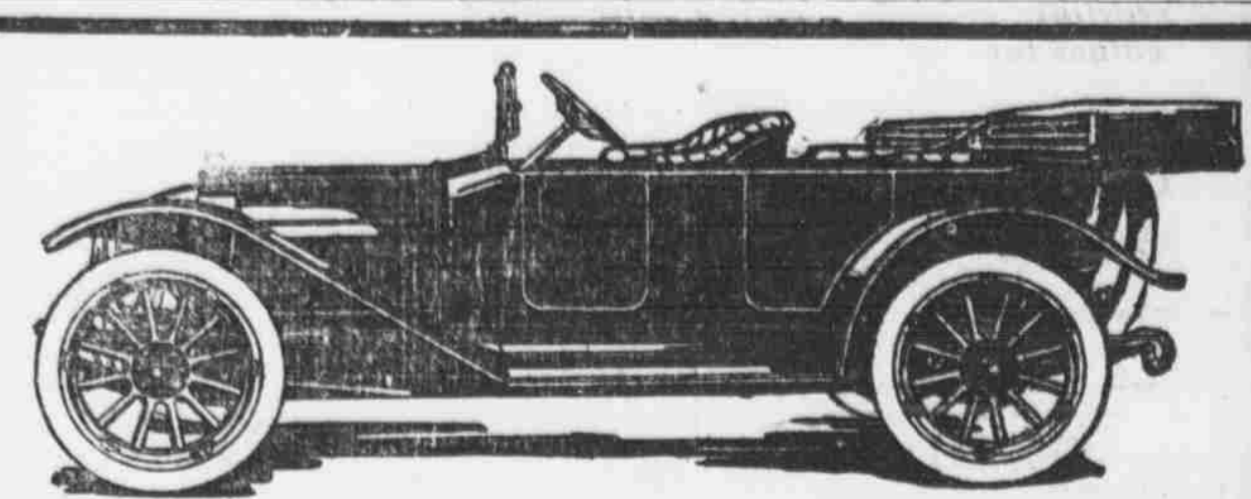

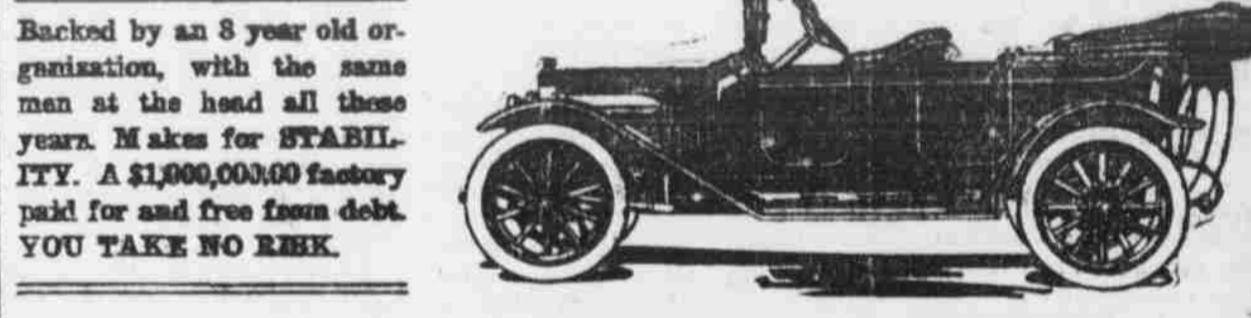
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
