MACHINERY DOES THE WORK

Food Prepared by Electricity in Caring for a Family of Five Thousand—Is a Big Job.

Planting three meals a day for the small American family is the arduous task from which the housewife is wont to eagerly seek "change and a rest."

How the care of the summer cottages dwindle in contrast with the gigantic task of sweeping and dusting between 17,000 and 18,000 rooms, where the occupants do not "belong out," but are "under foot" for a whole week.

Kitchen Looks Like a Machine Shop. One is first impressed by the elegance and simplicity, too, that behind the heavy fire and water-tight doors are the numerous kitchens, where simplicity ends.

In what looked most like an iron stationary tub, with large iron mixers, which were working by electricity, laubakaus, hash, with spices, minced itself without supervision, to be eaten for supper by a few, the chef said—200. Three large steam-operated cauldrons full of boiling water seemed to be in state of eruption.

Automatic Egg Boilers. The eggs are not cooked to perfection in this kitchen, the trouble must be with the eggs. A row of kettles, electrically heated, contain the boiling water.

Ice cream machines are here, too, where the cream refrigerator is handy. These cold-storage boxes are scattered all over the culinary departments of the ship; each refrigerator being devoted to but one class of eatable.

Dishwashing is a big item which the machines accomplish in short order, and only a small proportion of the china is broken; but it is very good quality Saxony china, with a simple royal blue band and monogram.

Cleaning House. Four times a day the chief steward's assistants must see that the dining room is cleaned. Every morning at 3 o'clock

the cleaning squad begins work, and the whole ship is gone over. Vacuum cleaners are used once during the trip and once in port. The mechanical cleaners save the water, which has to be carried from New York to Hamburg. Salt water washes decks, but not interiors. The drinking water taken on board is all carefully filtered. The ship has its own small laundry, but the bulk of the pile of linen

is disposed of in port. First, second, third and steerage cabins all have separate supplies, kitchens, cooks, steward as if each were a single-New York Post.
