BEATRICE, Neb., June 16.—(Special.)—Mrs. David Dunn of this city, who recently brought suit for divorce against her husband, was refused a decree Monday by Judge Pemberton.

WASHINGTON, June 16.—Organization of the new national banking and currency system entered its last stages today when President Wilson nominated the five men, who, serving with the secretary of the treasury and the comptroller of the currency, ex-officio, will constitute the federal reserve board.

Appointments Made to Reserve Board Upon their confirmation by the senate they will complete the organization of the new currency system. It is planned to have it in operation in time to care for the needs of the country during the crop moving season this fall.
