GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Nearly All Cash Wheat in Chicago Chartered for Export.

PRICES NOT AT LOW LEVEL Only an Increased Demand for Immediate Deliveries Will Make Valuations Stay Where They Are Now.

OMAHA, June 20, 1214.

Nearly all the cash wheat in the Chicago market has been chartered to go out. This makes the conditions surrounding the cash article stronger than it otherwise would be. The charters yesterday were 500,000 bushels soid for direct export. All this was old crop. Millers purchased 140,000 old wheat at Chicago, and it was said that there were 400,000 bushels new crop soid to go abroad. This big trade in the cash article will not cut any great figure in the matter of price boosting because of the lact that many millions of bushels of new wheat are now being prepared for shipment to any point wanting it. The purchases of new wheat by threago commission houses yesterday were again large, with lillnois, Kansas. Okiahoma and, in fact, nearly every atate in the winter wheat belt contributing more or less. Threshing returns were more favorable and there are some who believe that the total winter and appring crops will exceed 500,000,000 bushels provided the northwestern wheat turns out as well as that of the southwest. It will take a continued big demand for the cash wheat to prevent prices from declining further. Foreigners want much of this grain, but every one in the graft business knows that the buying side of the markets in the old world is cantious and that they will not load up with old that they will not load up with old business knows that the buying side of the markets in the old world is cautious and that they will not load up with old or new wheat at this particular time. It would be difficult to say as to the amount of wheat sold for foreign shipment, but it runs into the millions of bushels. The continent has probably made the largest purchases of any of the countries abroad, and it was said yesterday that both Germany and France were buying in this market and that bids for both wheat and flour from the smaller countries were

many and France were buying in this market and that bids for both wheat and flour from the smaller countries were more satisfactory than at any time on the new crop.

The country was selling wheat more freely late yesterday, and from the offerings from the southwest will increase unless prices are let down to a level considered by farmers as out of line. Corn closed irregular and unsettled, following a seasion where prices were broad and where declines were general for the nearby months, but the deferred were lacking mon
