Against the Serbs. SARAYEVO, Bosnia, June 29 .- Martial law was proclaimed today, both in the city and district of Sarayevo in consequence of the assassination yesterday of Archduke Francis Ferdinand and the

duchess of Hobenberg. A bomb thrown by a youth standing on the corner of the main street of the Bost nian capital, was the signal this morning for a serious anti-Servian outbreak, which the troops found considerable diffis mity in quelling.

The only damage done by the bomb was a slight injury to a passing Mussulman, but the rougher element selzed on the incident as a nexcuse to start s demonstration.

They were jointed by a number of Croas tian students, and the crowd passed along the streets stoning the windows of Servian shops, clubs and schools and houses and looting the interiors. The manifestante paraded the streets

with a portrait of Emperor Francis Jos seph at their head. They sang the Aust trian national anthem and attacked everything Servian until they were confronted by overwhelming troops. Martial law was proclaimed by beat of frum and the posting of placards. the chief points of the city were im-
