

LOPEZ DEFEAT ROURKES

Lincoln Wins in Fifteenth Inning From Omaha.

FINAL SCORE 1—FOUR TO THREE

Tight Pitching Duel Between Desau and Scroggins and Crabb—Outfield Error and Two Sacrifice Hits Let in Run.

LINCOLN, July 21.—(Special Telegram.)—Lincoln and Omaha battled fifteen innings this afternoon before the Antelopes finally won, 4 to 3, in a game which errors and the umpiring combined to make a regular farce.

Each team was guilty of six blunders in the field, and it was Kruger's error in dropping Quillin's high fly which finally allowed Lincoln to score the winning run.

Manager Lloyd was sent from the field in the fifth inning by the umpire for protesting too vehemently on a decision which prevented Lincoln from using the score in that inning, and the Lincoln team surrounded the umpire for several minutes before the game proceeded.

Omaha took two in the second when Thomas drove a terrific liner through McGuffigan for two bases. Conditon singled to left, Steibner singled to center and Krug beat out an infield hit.

Lincoln made one in the fifth when Blackburn tripled and Collins got an infield hit.

One for Omaha in Eighth.

Again in the eighth, Omaha got one. Crabb beat out an infield hit and Krug and Thomason followed with singles, scoring Crabb.

In the ninth, with one down, Collins singled and Blackburn followed with another safe drive. Williams forced Blackburn, but the umpire a minute later, declared Williams safe in an attempted steal of second. Graham handed Crosby's throw perfectly and it looked as if Williams was an easy out. The Omaha players protested, but to no avail. Crabb put two strikes over on Schreiber and then, after fouling off half a dozen, Schreiber drove one to the left field fence for two bases, tying the score.

Scroggins took the place in the tenth and pitched wonderful ball until the thirteenth, when three infield hits filled the bases, with but one out. It looked certain that Omaha would win, but Thomas grounded to Scroggins, the runner was retired at the plate and Thomas was out at first for the third out.

Unlucky Fifteenth.

In the fifteenth Quillin lifted a high fly just beyond the infield, which Kruger misjudged and Quillin reached second safely. McGuffigan bunted, but Crabb threw too late to catch Quillin and McGuffigan was safe. Smith's long sacrifice liner, of which Thomas made a beautiful catch and throw, scored the winning run.

Crabb pitched ball which deserved to win and held Lincoln helpless at practically all stages of the game. Thomas contributed some spectacular stunts—three catches in center, robbing batters of what appeared to be certain hits. Score: atvlop.G7.

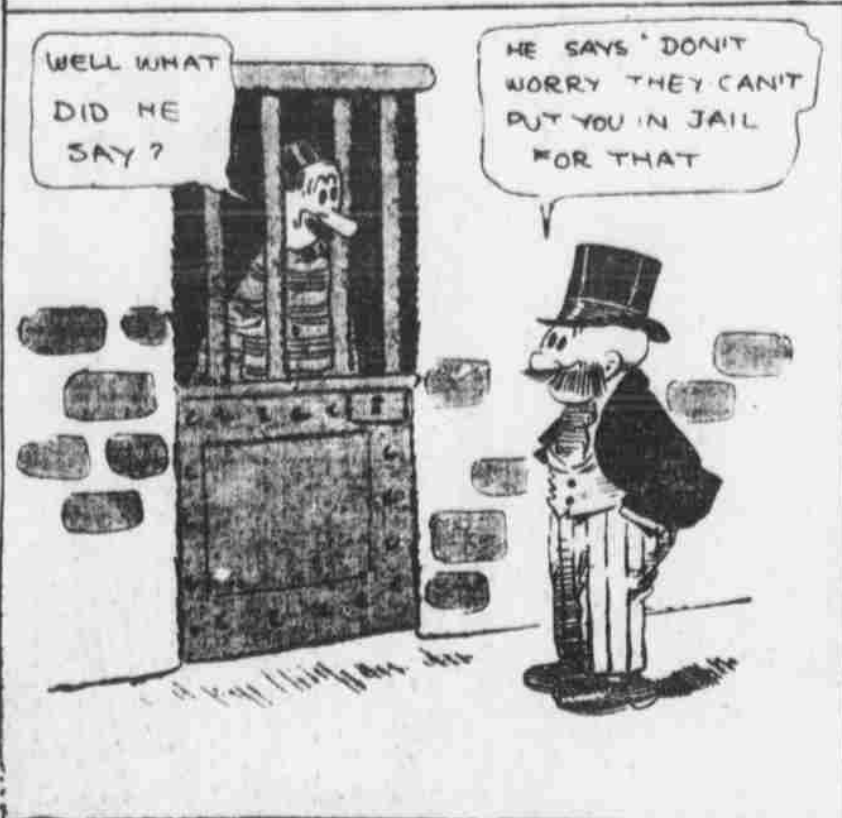
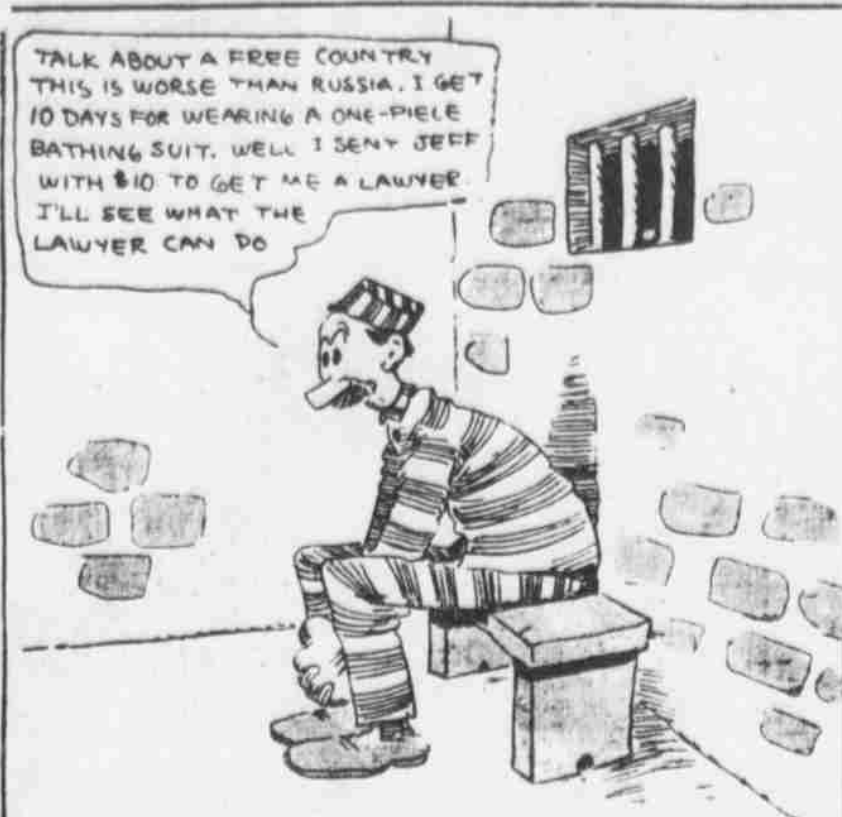
