NORRIS NOT WEDDED TO NAME

Senator from Nebraska Sends An-

swer to Nebraskans. (From a Staff Correspondent,)

WASHINGTON, Oct. 30 .- (Special Telegram.)-Senator Norris left for Massachusetts tonight, where he is to campaign in behalf of his former colleague, Representative A. P. Gardner, candidate for governor on the republican ticket. His principal opponent is a progressive, Charles S. Bird.

Certain Nebraska progressive supporters of Senator Norris wired him today exressing disapproval that he did not support Bird instead of Gardner. The senator has sent them a letter giving his reasons for supporting Gardner. They are based on the fight the two made against Speaker Cannon and so-called boss rule. He said in part:

"I would support Gardner regardless of politics on the ticket. He is bucking the machine rule in Massachusetts. I feel.it my duty to help him. No one secrificed more than Gardner in the rules fight. He had to turn his back on former supporters and members of his own family. I have never known a man who has superior courage or stronger fidenity to what his nacience told him was right."
