The decision of the supreme court sustains the findings of the district court of many months ago. The Missouri Pacific and Northwestern agred to do their share in its construction, but the Union Pacific resisted and went into court, contending that the city had not closed the street under the proposed viaduct and consequently there was no necessity for the spection of the structure.

In its finding the court holds that by losing the street abutting property would be seriously damaged and consequently tt ne d not be closed by the city.


