AUDITORIUM NOT FOR SALE

Directors of Company Withdraw the Offer Made to the City.

NOTICE SERVED ON CITY CLERK
Private Interests Said to Be Negotiating for Building and Are to Use it for Warehouse Purposes.

The directors of the Auditorium company have notified the city clerk that their offer to sell the building has been withdrawn temporarily. F. A. Nash suggests that the withdrawal may be permanent and the move is looked upon by those interested in the case as a possibility of the structure being sold to private persons.

The directors of the Auditorium submitted a proposition to the city council October 11 and October 23, a modified proposition, in which they pledged themselves to pay the cost of an election to vote on Auditorium bonds, provided no other question was submitted at the same election.

It is understood that private interests are seeking the Auditorium for a warehouse.

City commissioners voted favorably on the special election. The directors demanded \$25,000 for the Auditorium if sold to the city. It is said the proposition now being considered will bring the directors and stockholders a bigger return than any bargain that could be driven with the city.

Dedicate Church to Replace One Wrecked by Easter Tornado

The cornerstone of the Jennings Methodist church, formerly the Southwest Methodist church, will be laid Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the site of the new church on Fifty-first street, just north of Center street. Rev. C. W. McCaskill, pastor of the Hanscom Park Methodist church, will make the official address when the stone is laid and he will be assisted by other pastors of various Omaha Methodist churches.

The old Southwest church, which was a frame structure, was completely demolished during the Easter tornado, and when it was determined to construct a new concrete and stone building, with a full basement and substantial work, the committee decided to change the name of the church to the Jennings church in honor of Dr. Jesse W. Jennings, who was formerly pastor at the Trinity church and later district presiding elder here, and who is connected with a book concern at Kansas City.
