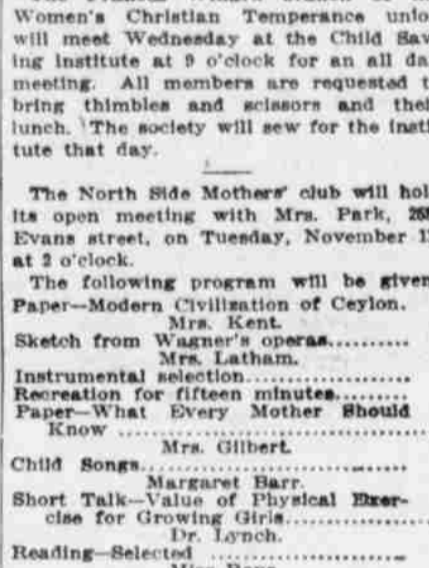
The young women's class in European history will meet Tuesday evening at 7:30 in the lecture room of the public library.

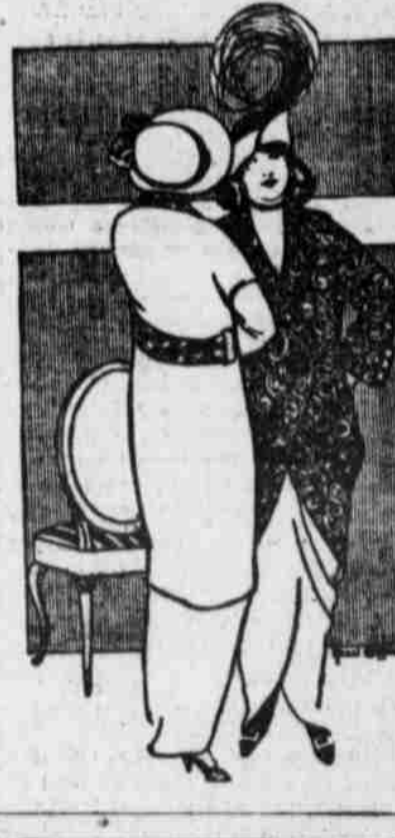
