## GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Wheat Shows a Complete Revival and Much Strength.

CORN UP TO EXPECTATIONS

Year's Vield Measures Up to the Eatimate Held Right Along by the Pit Traders in the Yellow Cereal.

OMAHA, Nov. 11, 1912.

It was almost a complete reversal of conditions surrounding the wheat market yesterday because of the strength at Liverpool, coupled with unfavorable crop news from the southern hemisphere. The day's gain at the big English market amounted to light and this, too, in the face of enormous world shipments, as compared with those of a week ago. The fear of the English millers that their supplies are likely to continue to dwindle, as the continent is getting a large part of the grain, was the cause of the strength there. Word came from Winnipeg that there were large transactions there in wheat on United Kingdom account, and that this wheat will be shipped abroad as rapidly as possible.

The buying of wheat yesterday was led by professionals and was not as strong as the selling. On the advance the larger commission houses filled up all comers, and some of them sold on the weak spots. It was a market that was boosted by the Argentine cables and these were in evidence through half a dozen different channels.

CHICAGO GRAIN AND PROVISIONS Features of the Trading and Closing

Prices on Board of Trade.

CHICAGO, Nov. II.—Widening of the damaged area in Argentina turned the wheat market today upgrade after there had been a material setback in prices. The close was nervous, varying from last night's figures to help's advance. Other leading staples all showed a net loss; corn, 168 to 155 to 100.

Increasingly serious news came from Posa Rio and Buenos Ayres in regard to crop injury by drouth throughout a large portion of the Argentine wheat belt. One dispatch spoke of ruin beyond repair over a region amounting to 1.20,000 acres in the south part of Buenos Ayres in the south part of Buenos Ayres province. Other advices said the Bahia Blanca and Pampas districts were badly hurt, extending west of a line from Aparico to Les Mostavos and from Tree Pescos on to Rivara. It was on adverse reports of this kind that the market railled nearly a cent a bushel with excited buying on the advance. One house alone was credited with acquiring more than 1,000,000 bushels.

Uncertainty as to how far the Argentine damage stretched was largely responsible for the early weakness in wheat. Ex-

Ilncertainty as to how far the Argentine damage stretched was largely responsible for the early weakness in wheat. Experts were also of the opinion that timely rains might yet induce a vigorous growth. Such influences, however, lost effect when more definite dispatches arrived from south of the Kouador. Note was taken, too, of the extreme meagerness of primary arrivals, the whole United States, aside from Mindoapolis and Duluth, obtaining less than 25,000 bushels.

Government crop figures heavily increased, compared with the estimate a month ago, depressed corn. Favorable weather for husking tended likewise to seep down prices. The oats market suffered on account of continued offerings of Canadian cargoes. Commission houses nevertheless were fair buyers at moderate decline.

Unloading by packers and stockyard

Quotations Moved Upward as They Declined Day Before. LIQUIDATION NOT APPARENT

Outside Influences Play Little Part in Shaping Course of the Market-Bonds Are Irregular.

NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—Quotations moved upward on the stock exchange today as abruptly as they declined yesterday. There was no sign of the liquidation which was the most disquieting feature of the preceding session and both railroad and industrial shares advanced strongly. Higher prices were well maintained until the last hour, when a swift reaction cancelled a large part of the day's gains.

The change in the market apparently was due primarily to the strong technical position.

Outside influences played little part in Call position.

Outside influences played little part in shaping the course of the market, although the more cheerful view, which was taken of the Mexican situation, was a factor in the upturn. It was felt that fears of an immediate crisis in the country's relations with Mexico had been exaggerated in the street. Buying for foreign account helped in the upward swing. London traded here freely, taking about 12,000 shares at balance. The copper stocks were benefited by the railly in copper metal abroad.

Bear traders sought to make capital of the arbitration board's award of an increase in wages to conductors and trainmen on the eastern roads. The decision, however, was of comparatively small significance in the eyes of speculators, for the reason that they had expected some such compromise would be made. It was contended also that the decision would arm the railroads with another argument in favor of increased freight rates.
