According to the reports submitted to and filed with the Interstate Commerce commission for the first three months of the fiscal year beginning July 1, the Pennsylvania railroad led all the others as a money maker. The report shows that during the three months the net revenue of that road was \$14,267,363.

The Burlington was second among the roads of the country and for the period reported showed a net revenue of \$9,635.891. The Northern Pacific was third, with \$7,335,158. The Rock Island, that has been reported to be in rather hard lines, came to the front with a net revenue of \$4,634,-289. The Illinois Central showed \$3,696,152; the Missouri Pacific, \$1,689,581, and the Great Western, \$1,160,785. There is no report made by either the Union Pacific or
