Income Tax Dodgers to Be Ferreted Out by the Government

Every available source of information is to be used immediately by revenue deputies to ascertain the names and addresses of persons and corporations taxable under the provisions of the new income tax law, according to a bulletin just received by Internal Revenue Collector Ross L. Hammond from the commissioner of internal revenue at Washington, D. C.

Information as to whether or not a man's income is above the total of exemptions allowed by the new law is to be sought from bankers, corporations, business men and anyone else who may have knowledge of the matter, according to the official bulletin. According to Collector Hammond persons who are asked to give out such facts will be assured that the information will be used exclusively in connection with the income tax work.

NEBRASKA CITY IS IN MIDST OF CLEANUP
