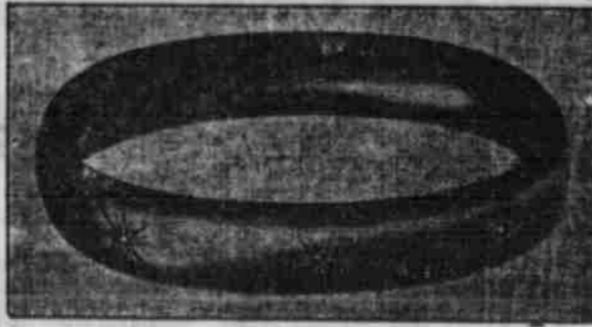

JUDGE SEARS HOLDS AGAINST BELANEGE

(Continued from Page One.)

for Cadet Taylor in the latter's libel suit against The Bee, he summoned into court to account for their relations with Wesley Gard, juror, was an unexpected sensation in the contempt hearing before Judge Sears of the district court. Clinton Broms took the stand in the morning session and H. C. Brown and Judge Shields were called for the afternoon hearing. It developed from Clinton Broms's testimony that he had twice defended Gard in suits in justice court within the last few months. The story of the second case came as a surprise. Young Mr. Broms admitted that this was an action brought by other persons to put Gard under bonds to keep the peace. The first case is on the court docket, having been appealed from justice court. Clinton Broms admitted that he had known Gard before the Taylor suit began; that he had told his father that Gard was his client and that neither of them had brought out the fact during the examination of jurors. He said that if they "hadn't been convinced the other side didn't know about it they might have disclosed the fact."

Gard Promises a Verdict.

Charles Belanega, the defendant in the contempt hearing, went through a detailed examination and cross examination and Prosecutor Magney was unable to shake his testimony. He testified that Gard, whom he had known six or seven years, told him that he was afraid he was "in a fix."
