

PANAMA EXPOSITION TO HAVE MANY TRANSPLANTED TREES

The work of transplanting trees from the nurseries to the Panama-Pacific In ternational exposition grounds has been commenced. The first to be planted were some acacias, pines and oypress, which were put in the large grassy park on the esplanade of the Marina, abreast of the Palace of Mines and Metallurgy. work of transplanting will be proactively

Concessions in 1915

More than 8,000 applications have been received for amusement and other concessions at the Panama-Pacific exposition in 1915. One hundred accepted to date involve a total expenditure of about \$7,000,-000. More than 7,000 people will be employed in the concessions district, and the total amount to be invested in amusements in 1915 will probably aggregate \$12,000,000. Among the most important cossions will be "The Grand Canyon of the Colorado;" a working model of the Panama canal; naval submarines in operation; "Creation," based on the first chapter of Geneals; "Toyland," a reproduction of the famous city of Nuremburg, Germany; "Fire and Sword," or the fall of Adrianople; an ice palace; "Forty-Niners' Camp," "Mohammed's Mountain, a Chinese city, and others.

Notes of the Panama Exposition. Notes of the Panama Exposition.

The many colored prisms that will be used in the novel and striking scheme of night illumination of the Panama-Pacific exhibit palaces are of a fine cut glass, made in Austria by a process not followed elsewhere. The prisms, known as jewels, are patiently tooled by hand in the homes of the artisans.

The road systems of the Panama-Pacific international exposition will form a part of an artistic color scheme. A material that will be widely used will be the "red cock" indigenous to California, the rich tint of which will lessen the glare and add to the warmth and color of the grounds.

The yacht harbor on the waterfront of the Panama-Pacific International exposition is about five acres in area and has such ample and convenient docking facilities that constwise steamers and other craft, some times alx or seven at a time, use it daily, discharging building material

material.

An imitation of the famous Travertine marble, from which the palaces of the Roman emperors were built, is being used to make the statuary and the covering of the exhibit palaces at the Panama-Pacific International exposition. The composition is a gypsum, rainproof and of unfading color: In tint it is a faint ivery yellow and is as smooth and hard as marble. The exposition sculptors and their assistants have formed a social club, called the Travertine club, since the are the first sculptors to use the material for this purpose.
