

### COST OF LIVING IN EUROPE

Higher Than in America, with Relative Wages Considered.

### OMAHA MAN MAKES COMPARISON

Takes on Incomes and Property Rapidly Rising to Maintain Enormous War Plans So Much Talked Of.

"The cost of living and therefore the cost of traveling in Europe is rapidly increasing," says Dr. H. L. Arnold, who, with Mrs. Arnold, has returned from four months abroad. They spent two months in Berlin, where Mrs. Arnold resided for six years; one month in Vienna and the remainder at various places. The doctor held a good deal of professional studying.

"It had been seven years since I was in Europe and the advance in the cost of living is enormous," says Dr. Arnold. "Everybody is impressed by it, residents and tourists. Four things strike an observant American: the high cost of living, low wages, prevailing talk of war and enormous taxes, much of which is on the income."

"Surely it would seem that Europe had had enough of war in the awful desolation of that Italian slaughter, the effect and extent of which we in this country do not understand or grasp. And yet Europe feels that the settlement is but temporary. But this is not the war so much anticipated."

"The man who thinks he can live in Europe as he does here for so much less is mistaken. I think, with few exceptions, he will find the cost of living there as high as here and in some respects higher. Certainly it is when the relative wages are considered."

Some Tangible Figures.

"Let me cite some figures I took the pains to gather. In Berlin, beautiful and delightful, where living really is a joy, sugar is 25 cents a pound, coffee from 26 to 28 cents, tea 50 cents to \$1.50, potatoes 87 cents per 100 pounds, beef 39 to 27 1/2 cents a pound, beef tallow 10 to 20 cents a pound, veal 40 cents, beef steak 50 cents, pork 40 to 42 cents a pound, eggs have been as high as 50 cents a dozen, but were down to 30 and 37 1/2 cents, butter 50 to 60 cents a pound. In London butter was 62 1/2 cents a pound, apples 2 1/2 pounds for 25 cents, coal of a medium soft grade, \$6 a ton. In Vienna good choice meat ran from 40 to 50 cents a pound, butter 40 cents and up. A great deal of oligomerization is consumed there and in Berlin. Bananas were 5 cents apiece in Vienna."

"Now, as to wearing apparel, all women's ready-made clothing is as high, or higher, than here. A man can get a suit made for much less in London or on the continent than in the United States, but the workmanship is very inferior. A friend of mine from Peoria had two suits made in London and gave both away, they fit so poorly. Shoes in continental cities are about the same price as in the United States; rubbers sell for from \$1 to \$1.50 a pair. I took from store windows some shoe prices of \$2 to \$4 a pair, which is from \$1.50 to \$3."

### High Club Dues Are Driving Some to Use but One of the Clubs

Right along with the increase of butter and eggs and other staple articles comes the rise in the expenses of those fortunate individuals who belong to the elite country clubs of the city. Both the Field club and the Country club became heavily involved in debt at the end of the last season and the Country club has already announced that it will raise a "voluntary subscription" while the Field club will either raise the dues or similarly raise a "voluntary subscription."

When the Country club became involved in debt last summer the directors decided to assess each stockholder \$20 and the notices of the assessment were mailed Wednesday. Wednesday night the retiring board of directors of the Field club announced that a deficiency of \$1,000 had to be met and the only way in which it could be done was by raising dues or raising a subscription. Members of the two clubs are very much disgruntled over the indebtedness. There is a general feeling among members of both clubs that the deficit is the result of improper management. Members of the Country club have not made any public complaints, but at the Field club meeting several stockholders gave voice to complaints that proper attention was not given to expenses and several other delinquencies on the part of the directors. Many stockholders of the two clubs, who enjoy the alternative of more than one club, have announced that they will resign from one or the other as they do not feel that they could afford to pay regular subscriptions to clear up deficits occasioned by poor management of both. The Omaha club found that the deficit side of the ledger was overbalancing the credit side a while back, but the deficiency of money was so small that no drastic measures had to be undertaken. Instead of increasing dues or raising a subscription, the directors of the club decided to amend the constitution with a provision setting aside members who were not compelled to pay the initiation fee, but only paid the yearly dues. Fifty new associate members were admitted to the club and the deficit was paid.

### Hotels of Omaha Found to Be Clean

Hotel and restaurant kitchens in Omaha are exceptionally clean and well appointed, according to State Hotel Inspectors P. F. Ackerman and T. T. Lapp, who are spending several weeks in the city inspecting eating houses and rooming places. "We have found several dirty kitchens and have served notices on the proprietors that they must clean up or be prosecuted," said Mr. Ackerman, "but the majority of the places are kept so clean as to be beyond criticism."

### KUGEL BUILDS WAGONBEDS FOR HAULING THE SNOW

Three snow wagons will be built by Street Commissioner A. C. Kugel as soon as the 1914 appropriations for the several city departments are available. If no snow falls the commissioner will use the wagons to haul leaves away in the fall. The wagons will be built with wide bodies and will be low, so that as little effort as need be will be expended in lifting the snow from the street to the wagon bed.

### MILWAUKEE PRESIDENT HERE

President Earling Hears Argument for New Line to Yankton.

### PROVES A GOOD LISTENER

But Says the Money Market is Too Tight for Such Extensive Line to Be Built at the Present Time.

President A. J. Earling of the Milwaukee road was in Omaha four hours yesterday and they were about as busy hours as he has put in in a long time. He came from St. Paul and left for Chicago on a special at noon, accompanied by J. H. Hillard, vice president in charge of passenger traffic, and D. L. Bush, vice president in charge of operation and construction.

While in Omaha President Earling talked railroad business with F. A. Nash, the company's general western agent; a line into South Dakota with a committee of Omaha jobbers and shippers; and then told the newspaper men that the double track construction on the Omaha-Chicago line is progressing as rapidly as possible and that it will likely be finished early next season.

President Earling did not promise anyone that the Milwaukee will build to the northwest and open new territory in South Dakota, that it may be put in touch with Omaha as a market for the Milwaukee road, but he listened to the arguments of the Omaha business men who presented their statements in favor of a line of road from Omaha to Yankton. They went beyond this and pointed out to him that with such line built and operated by the Milwaukee Omaha could be in touch with the territory tributary to the company's main line, west of Moberge. Members of the committee contended that with the patronage that Omaha has given the Milwaukee and that with the patronage it is still giving it, the city and its interests are entitled to at least this much recognition.

President Earling proved to be a good listener and, after the committee of Omaha business men had concluded, he remarked that the Milwaukee road recognized the mutual advantages that would accrue, adding that this would not be an opportune time to undertake any extension that would involve the raising of so large a sum of money as would be required to carry the proposed project to completion.

### Britt Holds that Auto Guarantee is Binding on Givers

The one-year guarantee against the breaking of parts of an automobile that many dealers give with every machine that they sell is absolutely binding, according to the first court decision bearing on the point ever made in Omaha.

The court room was crowded by eager automobile dealers and owners when Justice of the Peace C. W. Britt disposed of the case of the Traynor Auto company against Charles S. Moore, the owner and operator of a taxicab. The defendant purchased his machine from the plaintiff company last June and got with it a guarantee that it would "stand up" for one year. In less than three months the transmission case was cracked, necessitating the purchase of a new one. The repairs were made by the Traynor Auto company, and a bill of \$2.75 was presented to Moore. He refused to pay it and the suit for collection followed. Justice Britt accepted not the testimony of the plaintiff seeking to show that the defendant had broken because it had not been properly oiled, but that of the defendant, which tended to show that it had worn out. It was held that the automobile company could not collect.

### Heavily Fined for Accosting Women

Mac Anderson, South Omaha, who has a falling for wine, women and—wine, took a northbound street car and migrated to Omaha Wednesday evening, where he immediately proceeded to seek a berth behind prison bars.
