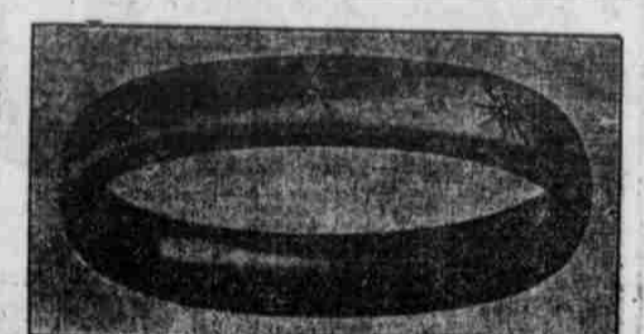

### BARNES FACTION DEFEATED

Radicals in Control of New York State Republican Conference.

### FAVOR DIRECT PRIMARY LAW

Chairman's Motion to Reaffirm Plank in Last Party Platform Beaten by Vote of 102 to 187.

NEW YORK, Dec. 6.—The radicals ruled the republican state conference this afternoon and forced the approval of a direct state-wide primary law. State Chairman William Barnes' motion to reaffirm the more conservative primary plank in the last republican platform was defeated by a vote of 182 to 187. The radicals, led by Henry L. Stimson, former secretary of war, split with Mr. Barnes and his followers over the question of retaining party conventions. The state chairman favored the direct nomination of congressmen, members of the state legislature and county and municipal officers, but would keep the state convention for the nomination of governor and the other officers on the state ticket. He wanted delegates to this convention chosen directly by the voters, who should have the right also to

express direct preference for nominations for state officers if they so desired.

### Candidates on Equal Footing.

This did not suit Mr. Stimson and his friends and after a long debate they carried a small majority of the conference with them. The resolution adopted declared that all candidates should stand on an equal footing. It opposed the use of party emblems on the general election ballot and the factional column on the primary ballot. At the same time it expressed belief in party organization and reiterated the doctrine of former Governor Hughes that the direct primary should be an adjunct to and a check upon, rather than a substitute for the deliberation and conference of the party's representatives. The conference was called by the state committee to recommend legislation to the republican members of the state assembly, which was returned to republican control in the last election. Since nearly all the republican assemblymen-delegate participated in the conference, its recommendations were considered binding and were accepted as the program of the assembly majority at the next regular session.

### Recommendation of Meeting.

The meeting recommended the adoption of a vigorous compulsory workmen's compensation law, reform of the rules of the assembly, and the amendment of the state constitution to take all state

officers except those of governor and lieutenant governor out of the elective list and empower the governor to fill them by appointment.

A motion to include judges of the court of appeals among the officers to be appointed by the governor was defeated.

Reference to the progressives who had left the party was made by Job E. Hedger, former candidate for governor, who said, "let's tell them to come on back and stop their nonsense and let's get busy."

### Physician Fatally Stricken Upon Car

Dr. J. Walter E. K. Davis, 3204 Taylor street, died of heart failure last evening while homeward bound on a Sherman avenue car. He had been a sufferer from heart trouble for some time. His death was first discovered by Rev. J. F. Schwarz, who sat next to him in the car and who took charge of the body until the coroner had been summoned. Since 1897 Dr. Davis had been a resident of Omaha, practicing medicine here for the last twenty-five years. He is survived by his widow and two sons, Charles and Walter, of eastern Pennsylvania, and three brothers, Ed L. of Phillipsburg, Conn.; W. H. Davis, Sparks, Neb., and J. P. Davis, Omaha. Funeral arrangements will be announced today.

### ORGANIZE, SUFFRAGE SLOGAN

Mrs. Draper Smith Says Will Get Experienced Worker.

### WANT EXPERT IN THE FIELD

Head of Nebraska Association Says Reports at Conference Indicate Best Results Come Only In This Way.

(From a Staff Correspondent.) WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—(Special Telegram.)—An experienced campaign organizer devoted to lining up Nebraska for woman's suffrage will be secured from national suffrage headquarters for next year's campaign, according to the plans of Nebraska delegates to the suffrage convention which closed its sessions here today.  
 Mrs. Draper Smith of Omaha, president of the Nebraska association, declared tonight that reports from those states which had been through campaigns without organizers convinced her of the necessity of experienced workers and she will recommend to her Nebraska workers the appointment of an expert.  
 "We shall win suffrage at the polls in 1914," declared Mrs. Smith tonight.  
 "We have sufficient signers to our petition to insure that the question will go on the ballot and I am confident it will carry Nebraska, as one of the so-called campaign states, will have special attention from the national organization, and we intend to make a vigorous fight."  
 A former Nebraskan, Mrs. Frances Maule Bjorkman, was a prominent figure at the convention. She is a daughter of John P. Maule, late city attorney of Lincoln. She is now a paid officer of the national suffrage movement, in charge of their literature.

### TAXICAB RATES ARE RAISED

Considerable More is Now Charged Than Before the Consolidation.

### CHARGE NOW FOR EXTRA FARES

When More Than One Passenger Uses Taxi, Then an Addition is Made to the Meter Rate for Each Extra.

Taxicab rates have been boosted in Omaha and many who have been using the taxis for the first time since the disagreeable weather set in are feeling the effect and entering complaints. It is now asserted by the Omaha Taxi company, the company which is a consolidation of the Omaha Taxi company and the Grey Bonnet company, that the prices are now the same as they are in Chicago, and that they were forced to make the increase to continue in business.

Several cases of increased charges were presented to Treasurer Hawke of the Omaha Taxi company and its explanation was:

"The prices were raised when we consolidated, and while they are now considerable more when more than one passenger is hauled they are less than before when only one is carried. When additional passengers are hauled we make an additional charge of 25 cents on top of the meter rate for one passenger, so that for a short haul, for instance, if the meter rate is 12 and three

extra passengers are hauled we charge \$1.00."

The case was cited where one of his drivers charged a business man of this city \$1.50 for hauling three people from the Loyal hotel to the union station. To this Mr. Hawke said:

"Our rate for transcripts from the hotels to the station is 60 cents a passenger and our driver had no way of telling that it was a business man making a short drive."

The change in rates increases the price to those who take their families to the theater. Under the old Grey Bonnet rate the charge from the West Farnam district was about \$1.10 one way. Now, under the additional charge of 20 cents a passenger it costs a man \$1.30 to take a party of four one way in the taxi, or \$2.30 for both ways, whereas the old rate was \$2.30.

### SIGNATURES COMING RAPIDLY

Advocates of Woman's Suffrage Meet and Compare Notes.

### SATISFIED WITH THE RESULTS

Express Opinion that Enough Names Will Be Added to Petitions to Secure Submission of Amendment.

Over 2,000 signatures of Omaha and Douglas county voters have been secured on the petitions being circulated for the submission of the woman suffrage amendment to the constitution, at the state election next spring, according to announcement at the regular meeting of the Omaha executive committee of the Nebraska Woman Suffrage association Friday afternoon.

Only four women attended on account of the unfavorable weather and a failure to announce the meeting as an open one. Mrs. Z. T. Lindsey, Douglas county chairman, presided in the absence of Mrs. W. C. Sunderland, who is chairman for Omaha in the petition work.

The women felt quite satisfied with the showing made on the petition signers in Douglas county, including Omaha, as only 5,600 signers are considered this county's share. The total number needed in Nebraska is 38,500, in order to obtain the submission of the woman suffrage amendment at the election.
