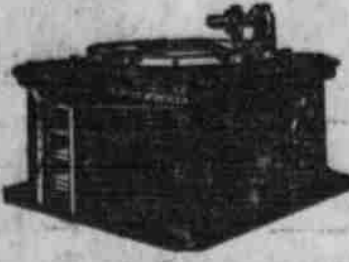


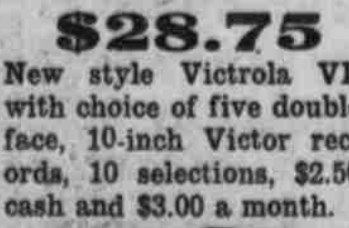

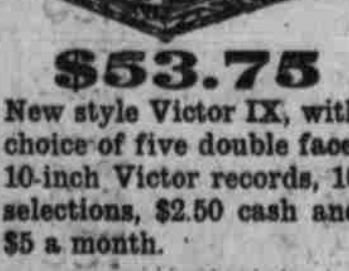

### TOPICS FOR A DAY OF REST

Rev. and Mrs. Snyder to Celebrate Anniversary of Mission Work.  
BISHOP SCANNELL WILL PREACH

Observance of the fortieth anniversary of Rev. and Mrs. G. W. Snyder's home missionary service begins this evening with a reception to the veteran Christian workers, at the residence of Mr. and Mrs. R. H. Fritz, 128 S. Jackson street. All friends and acquaintances of Rev. and Mrs. Snyder and his wife are invited. Continuing the celebration of their fortieth anniversary, an extensive program of services will be held Sunday.

At Zion Lutheran mission, Magnolia hall, 2041 Ames avenue, of which Rev. Charles E. Cobhey, pastor, there will be meetings at 10 and 11 o'clock, addressed by Rev. L. J. Powell, of West Point. Rev. H. L. Yarker, D. D., of Atchison, Kan., and Rev. Luther P. Ludden, D. D., of Lincoln.

At St. Matthew's Lutheran church, Nineteenth and Cassel streets, which is Rev. Mr. Snyder's main pastorate services will be held at 10:30, 1:30 and 7 o'clock. Besides the aforementioned ministers, Rev. S. H. Yerman, Rev. C. S. Swartz, Rev. E. F. Kistler, Rev. Leonard Groh, D. D., all of Omaha, and other pastors, will make addresses.

To close the three days' celebration of this remarkable forty years of home mission work, a reception will be held at St. Matthew's church, at 7:30 o'clock, Monday evening. All friends of Rev. and Mrs. Snyder and of their congregations are invited. Short addresses will be made by Rev. J. M. Cromer, D. D., of South Auburn, Neb.; Rev. E. L. Bishop Scannell will preach at the 11 o'clock mass Sunday morning at St. Cecilia's cathedral.

A three days' special devotion, in connection with the feast of the immaculate conception, will begin tomorrow morning at the 10:30 mass of the Holy Angels church. The devotion is intended for the soldiers of the blessed Virgin Mary, but the entire congregation may avail themselves of the opportunity. Father Livingstone of Creighton university will conduct these services, which will be brought to a close on Wednesday morning. Holy Angels' church is located at Twenty-eighth and Fowler avenue, and the pastor is Father Flanagan.
