"Deplorable condition" is what most of the members of the municipal affairs committee of the Commercial club thought of the city jail after an inspection tour through it yesterday afternoon.

The members have been discussing for some time the need of a new jail and have heard Commissioner Ryder on various occasions declare the conditions at the present place, and now that they have seen for themselves, it is probable they will set together soon in endeavor to secure better quarters for the law-breakers.

After the visit to the jail the committee members went over the switching facilities for the wholesale and factory houses on lower Harney and Howard streets and were told by those who had made a study of such conditions that these houses and others being contemplated were badly in need of better facilities for freight handling.
