STARTS SUIT TO RECOVER FACE OF INSURANCE POLICY

Mr. Freiden asserts that he took out a policy against damage by tornado, cyclone, wind storm, lightning and fire on his household effects in 1910 when he resided in Creston, Neb.; that the policy was for a period of five years and that he has since moved twice, first to Omaha, then later to the address at which the tornado struck his belongings and that at each one of these he notified the insuring company of the changes.
