A woman who said her name is Rose Davis attempted suicide early last night in the Powell apartments at 33 South Sixteenth street, by swallowing carbolic acid.

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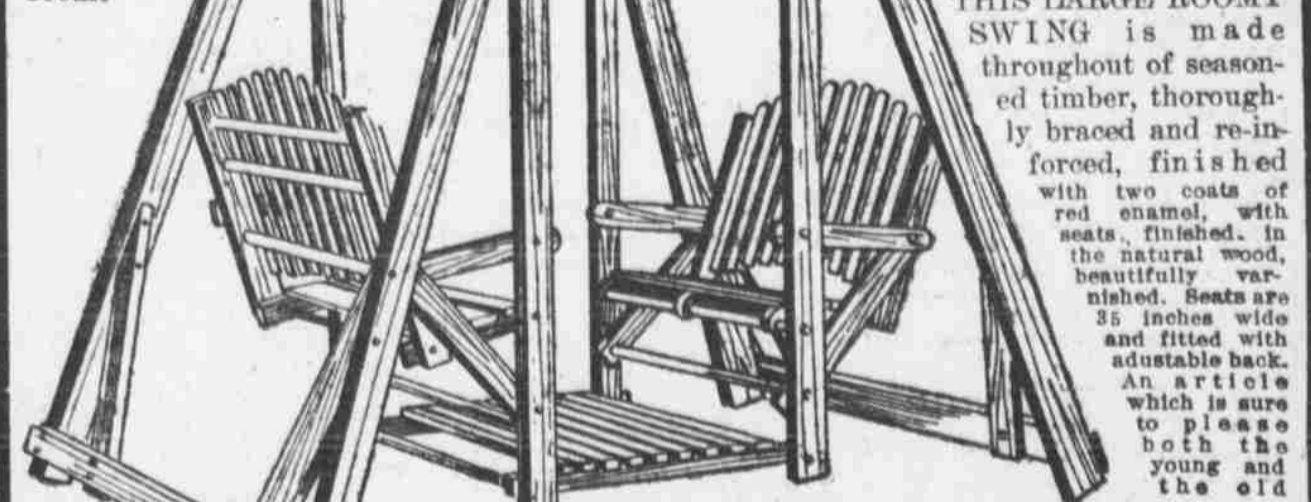

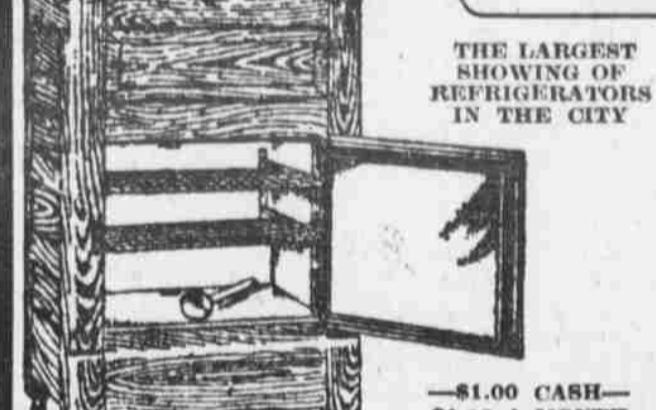
