## Administration Not Committed to Sliding Tobacco Tax Policy

WASHINGTON, June 7.-In view of the widespread idea that Attorney General McReynolds' proposal for a graduated excise tax on the output of tobacco was the expression of a new policy on the part of the Wilson administration to correct trust evils, White House officials tonight disclaimed that any general policy had been discussed or adopted.

President Wilson and the attorney general discussed the numerous reports that had gone forth and later White House officials decided to explain just what had taken place in the councils of the administration on the tobacco industry thus

was described as "a suggestion" offered on its merits for discussion and bearing neither the approval nor disapproval of the administration when broached to the senate finance committee for consideration as an amendment to the coming tariff bill.

# Another Issue of School Bonds Sought

The Board of Education will call a special election next fall, at which will be submitted the proposition of voting \$790,000 bonds for the construction of new school houses and the repairing of old buildings. Part of this money will be used to build permanent playgrounds and improve those already established.

"We would have saked the people for these bonds this summer," said President Holovtchiner of the board, "but the tornado upset all plans. This money is needed badly, for some of the schools are congested, and some of the buildings are old and new structures are needed." President Holovtchiner has been making a strenuous campaign to explain to the voters the need of these bonds. He has addressed improvement clubs and civic organizations. There has to date appeared no organized objection to the bonds. The election will be called in September or October, but if arrangements for it cannot be completed than the proposition will be submitted at the November election.

### LIGHTNING HITS CHURCH; THREE IN IT ARE KILLED

FREEPORT, Ill., June 7 .- A bolt of lightning struck the German Reformed church near here today, killing three members of the congregation and badly injuring a fourth. The church building was burned to the ground.
