He was found wandering around in a dazed condition near the street car power house and brought to police headquarters, where after much difficulty, his story was dragged from him. Angelo came to Omaha Saturday, and obtained a room at the Paxton. He checked out Saturday night and was looking about the city when he met another Lincoln man whose name he does not know. He says that a few minutes after the meeting he apparently lost his senses. The police are mystified by his story, and after Angelo's mind had cleared up somewhat, at his own suggestion he was put on a train bound for the capital city.

Omaha Builders Get Contracts for Many Structures in State

Omaha contractors are getting much of the business of the smaller cities in Nebraska and Iowa. Hints & Malloy have been awarded a contract to build a general public schoolhouse at Anstis, Ia., to cost \$3,000. The bank of Anstis, to cost \$7,000, will be built by Hasmussen & Kyhl of Omaha, who also have been awarded contract to erect a \$5,000 bank building at Hooper, Neb., and a \$25,000 high school building at Villisca, Ia. William Creedon & Sons of Omaha will have received the contract to build a school at Neligh, Neb., which will cost \$34,000. The plans for these buildings were drawn by Lloyd Willis, the Omaha architect.

Public Schools to Close on Friday

Public schools of the city will close Friday afternoon. The Central High school exercises will be held Friday night. Mutilated Body of H. C. Perrine Found Near Bennington

A stock train which arrived early Monday morning in South Omaha had a portion of a man's trousers and blood spots on the brakebeam of one of the cars, which later led to the discovery of a dead man near Bennington. Two parts of the man's body were found by a farmer a mile west of that town. The body was found in a pocketbook with \$2.50 in it and a keyring bearing a check with the name "H. C. Perrine, Auburn, Neb., 1911." Coroner Crocker is investigating as to the identity of the man.

DISTRICT JUDGES TO USE CIVIL SERVICE RULES

Judges at the court house have arranged what amounts to an informal civil service system with regard to employees named by them and under their direction. Political affiliations are no longer considered and appointments and promotions are determined only by merit. In accordance with this system, Judge Crawford of the county court, has appointed J. G. Sherry, 1515 Spencer street, file clerk in the office of the clerk of court. Sherry is a democrat and has had a prominent part in local politics. W. S. MacEachron, who was file clerk, is a republican.

CRAWFORD CITIZENS TO HOLD UNIQUE STREET FAIR

The citizens of Crawford, Neb., have hit upon a street fair and carnival idea which they think will draw a crowd. They are to hold their street fair and carnival June 26-28, and in addition to the usual attractions for festivals, they will sell at auction 107 town lots, eleven residences, seven farms, 130 head of horses, 200 head of cattle, 200 head of sheep, 200 head of pigs, and thousands of two-sheet posters, printed in colors, being distributed within a radius of 500 miles.
