JUSTICE NOT HARDLY JUST

Hits Out a Three-Bagger When the Bases Are Filled with Bourkes.

FOUR RUNS RESULT FROM TRICK

Lincoln Defeated, Eight to Three, Not Being Able to Connect After the Fourth Inning.

After having made a pretty three-base hit the previous inning, Eddie Justice broke up yesterday's game with Lincoln in the fifth, when he slammed out another three-bagger with the bases crowded. Not being satisfied with this, he piffed home while Jordan was winding up. Omaha got the long end of the 4 to 3 score.

Manager Arbogast changed the entire batting order of the Bourke machine and the new shift seemed to be a good one. Thomson leads off and in addition to being a good hitter is a good water. Coyle was forced into the game yesterday and bats in his old position. "Skipper" Schipke is suffering from a split finger and a bad toe, the result of a mixup at St. Joseph in the last game. Neff was placed at second, thus compelling Coyle to play the field, although hindered by a pair of Charleyhorses.

Justice was the shining light and time after time robbed the Antelope batters of what looked like sure hits. He made a brace o ferra, but it was because of his taking chances and they were excusable. In the opening frame he robbed Davy Lloyd of a hit back of second base. In the third inning he made a wonderful stop of another of Lloyd's balls and although he made a bad peg to Kane, the Bourke first sacker speared the ball with one hand.

Errors Help Lincoln.

Applegate pitched a good game for the Bourkes, and the Antelopes should have had but one run off his offerings, but in the second inning, two hits were aided and abetted by three errors, netting two goals. The Bourke recruit allowed two six-hits and struck out eight men. In control was better than it has been in any other game this season. He passed two men.

Lincoln started after the game early, securing two runs in the second inning. McCormick was safe on an infield hit and took second on Justice's bad peg to first. For Omaha Justice tripled in the fourth, with two down and scored on Grubb's single. With one down in the fifth, Coyle singled and took second when Kane beat out a bunt. Johnson was winged, filling the bases. Coyle scored on Congator's sacrifice fly. Neff walked choking the bases and Justice slammed out a triple scoring Kane. Johnson and Neff and scored himself later by stealing home.
