ROURKES GET EVEN BREAK

Omaha Blanks Sioux in Second Game After Loss in Morning.

ONLY FOUR HITS OFF APLEGATE

Second Contest Won by Locals, Two to Nothing, While First Goes to Visitors, Seven to Three.

After losing the morning game to Josh Clark's Sioux City Indians by a 7 to 3 score, Omaha came back yesterday afternoon and played the visitors off their feet, winning the best played game of ball seen in Omaha this season by a score of 2 to 0.

Abel Aplegate worked on the mound in the afternoon game and was effective to say the least. He allowed but four hits, two of which came in the closing chapter.

The morning game was long and uninteresting. It belonged to the Indians long before the close of the battle. Close-up delivery was solved in the first three innings, during which time Sioux City knocked the game Omaha right out of the park, but could not overcome the lead held by the Indians.

In the afternoon game situations were common. Fast and clever fielding and good twirling were the rule. Aplegate had the better of the pitchers' contest. The Rourkes hammered out nine hits off White, but they were badly scattered and in most cases counted for nothing more than the increase in the players' batting averages.

Thomasson pulled off the prize play of the afternoon game in the sixth inning. White opened up with a single to center. Craig lined one out over second base. Thomasson came in on the ball and made a wonderful catch of it. He satisfied with this, he whipped the ball over to Kane and completed a double, setting White at least ten feet off the initial mark.

Harvey Grubb also played a great game. In the sixth inning Yano started off with a line which looked like a sure hit past third base. Grubb made a stab at the pill with his gloved hand and the ball struck. In the same inning, with Chief on second base, he made a sensational stop of Smith's drive between third and short, and while on the field ran out to Kane. Had the ball gotten by there is no doubt but what Craig would have crossed the rubber.

Head Overcomes Umpire. Umpire George Segrist was overcome by the heat in the seventh round and was carried from the field. Catcher Rapp of Sioux City and Corie assumed to handle the indicator for the remainder of the game.

For the first five innings of the afternoon game neither team scored a run, although the Rourkes were dangerous several times. A double play in the sixth inning, when Omaha had a man on second and another on third, quashed the Rourkes' chance of scoring in this frame. Again in the fifth the Rourkes had a chance to score with a man on second and one out, but White tightened and the next two batters sent up little pop flies.

Aplegate opened the sixth for the home team with a shining double to the center field fence. Thomasson beat out a line and Aplegate went to third, from whence he appropriated on Justice's single to left.

The next inning White pitched elegant ball and the only chance of scoring the home team had was out short by another double play.

Thomasson opened the eighth with a double in his third consecutive hit-and-run. Justice followed with a single, being his third consecutive hit also—and Thomasson slipped over the rubber with the last tally of the day. Score, morning game:
