Exporters Take Large Amount of Wheat for Shipment.

CORN RULES A LITTLE LOWER

Traders Prepare Market for a Possible Bearish Report from Government on Outlook for the Yellow Cereal.

OMAHA, July 10, 1913.

It was estimated after the close of the Board of Trade last night that July 10, 1913, 600 bushels of wheat were taken late yesterday by exporters. The larger part of this grain was old, hard winter wheat which will go out via the Gulf. Ocean freights are now down to bedrock, but one of the largest firms in the export trade of Chicago said last night that the market for wheat is not as plentiful as it was a few days ago and that rates are stiffening a little. These conditions more than anything else was the influence in the market of securing the old grain. As an offset to this has been the fact that the wheat buyers have purchased of new and old grain in the country to come to Chicago. The total being nearly 1,000,000 bushels in all positions. Some of the concerns with headquarters in Chicago have branched out throughout the southwest and their purchases of wheat and sales for export are in some instances included in the Chicago business.

Wheat is moving freely in all sections where threshing has been done, and every section of the southwest is reporting an increased movement as a certainty. Cash wheat was 1/2c higher. Corn rule is 1/4c higher. Primary wheat receipts were 71,000 bushels and shipments 45,000 bushels, against 60,000 bushels last year. Primary corn receipts were 40,000 bushels and shipments 35,000 bushels, against 35,000 bushels last year.

During the first hour of the session the market advanced on the news of a Canadian Pacific, yesterday's weak feature, bounded up and Union Pacific nearly as much. Other prominent members of speculation rose a point or more. The remainder of the session changes were small. The list dipped downward again shortly before the close, but part of the day's advance was retained in most cases.

The action taken by President Wilson, in the hope of averting a strike of coal miners and trainmen on the eastern railroads, was rated as the most important influence on the constructive side of the market.
