### Marble Imitations for Decorative Tone at the Panama Fair

Imitations of three of the most famous and beautiful Italian marbles used for generations in attaining decorative effects and representing the acme of human in genuity in perfecting artificial stone wilbe seen at the Panama-Pacific International exposition in 1915.

The marbles which now are being imi tated to add to the distinctiveness and beauty of the exposition decorative scheme are Travertine-which will forn the exterior finishing of exposition build ings-Sienna and what is known as Verde antique.

Travertine marble is found in the bo and along the shores of the river Tibeand is believed to be of a voicanic origin Its imitation has been perfected by Paul E. Denivelle, an expert in the imitation of various stones. The shade of the marble, an old ivory, is the key color of the exposition

Imitations of the other marbles, Sienna and Verde antique, also have have been perfected by Denivelle and are being propared for the exposition under his direc tion. The Sienna, of a reddish color streaked with yellow and black, has been used in columns along the main entrance of the Palace of Machinery, Verde antique will be used for urns and other ornamen tation in several of the interior courts.

#### "Toyland Grown-Up" at the Panama Fair to Tour Around World

Frederick Thompson, creator of the \$1,000,000 concession, "Toyland Grown Up," at the Panama-Pacific International exposition has announced that the gigantic figures and buildings of his concession, which will represent characters of the Mother Goose rhymes and their abodes, will be constructed in sections and placed together with hinges and other devices so that they can be taken apart and folded up when the exposition

From San Francisco "Toyland Grows Up" will be shipped to Japan, where it will be set up and the spirit of oriental toyland will be added by new features. After the concession has been shown in Japan it will be packed up and moved to India, then to Berlin, where the necessary additions will be made, so that when Toyland Grown Up" returns to New York five years hence it will represent according to the plans of its originator. the toyland of the world.

The following nations will participate officially in the Panama-Pacific International exposition at San Francisco in 1915: Argentina leading with an appropriation of \$1,300,000 (gold); Bolivia. Bulgaria, Cuba, China, Costa Rica, Canada, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, France be a feature of the exhibit.

A model of the Panama canal, 500 feet in length, will be among the exhibits by the United States government at the Panama-Pacific International exposition. Of the \$500,000 appropriated by congress for federal exhigits, \$60,000 has been turned over to the Isthmian Canal commission for the construction of the model. The model, complete in all working details will allow the passage of toy boats. It will be built to scale.


