#### Ure Ready to Take Up Butler's Plan for More Interest

City Treasurer W. C. Ure marched into the city council chamber armed with arguments and facts about city funds and ready to deal with the suggestion of Commissioner Dan B. Butler that banks should give surety bonds for city moneys with a bird of paradise design appliqued deposited in them-and then Mr. Ute marched right out, for the council refused to discuss the plan at this time.

Commissioner Butler, who proposed the plan, was out of the city and Commissioner J. J. Ryder, acting chairman of the committee of the whole, at the council's request, indefinitely postpored the consideration of the measure.

Along wih his statment in which he declared banks should give surety bonds instead of the bonds of directors or other officials of the bank Butler suggested that the interest on city money be raised from 2 to 2% per cent, since state money draws 3 per cent.

The plan may be taken up and considered when Butler returns.
