Corn Market Drifts Into Huge Scapling Affair.

BUYING FROM ARGENTINA

Yellow Cereal is Being Purchased from South American and Continues to Come in for Distribution.

OMAHA, April 4, 1914. "Will corn hold up without proper?" is a question asked by many of the more conservative traders in the market. Cash corn has drifted into a huge "scapling affair," and not unlike the pendulum of a clock it swings to and fro every day. The price changes were \$4 1/2 and while the best values of the crop were not yet taken up, the market was a firmer undertone, and especially for the May future.

Argentine corn is still being purchased to come into this country, the latest movement, it was said yesterday, being the taking of a cargo of that grain which will come to Chicago via Montreal.

One of the drawbacks to the corn market at Chicago yesterday was the fact that 200,000 bushels of Argentine receipts, of 300,000 bushels more than a year ago.

There was little change in the wheat market.

NEW YORK STOCK MARKET

Creeching Advance Results in Recovery of Some of Lost Ground.

HILL SHEARS SHOW STRENGTH

American Issues as Dull in London as at Home and Little Trading in Wall Street for Foreign Demand.

NEW YORK, April 4.—A creeping advance in stocks today resulted in the recovery of some of the ground lost yesterday. Retiring of short contracts, customary at the week-end, provided the principal demand. Although trading was dull, the light recovery was sufficient in view of the prevailing scarcity of stocks, to bring about upturns among the greater number of active shares.

It was the judgment of professional traders that speculative selling had been cleared as far as possible, and that with safety at present, despite the pessimistic view of sentiment.

Hill shears were strong, but gains in most instances were held to small fractions. American stocks were as dull in London as here and there was little trading in this market for foreign account.

That forecasts of bank statements are of small value at the quarterly period was shown once more today. Instead of the expected cash gain of \$4,000,000 more, there was a loss of more than \$8,000,000.
