OMAHA. April 7. 1914.

In a roundup of the exporters at Chicago, coupled with advices from the seaboard, there has been no yeasel room taken worthy of mention for the new crop of wheat. This fact presents a more bearish appearance than the average wheat owner cares to say. From present indications, with a visible supply of nearly \$2,00,000 bushels of wheat in the United States, and the visible larger than generally believed, there will be a great deal of this grain available, and unless the holders in this country meet the views of foreign buyers, there will be heavy offerings of breadstuffs when the new winter wheat crop is ready to move next summer.

While the visible supply of wheat in the United States decreased 1.773,000 bushels the last week, the Canadian visible increased 721,000 bu. The total in the country north of us is now 21,214,000 bushels and while this is 5,000,000 bushels in excess of stocas of a year ago, the larger exporters at Montreal and Winnipeg say that it will be necessary for holders to cut the price below that now being asked by Russia in order to place the surplus on the markst. The holders of wheat in our own northwest, as well as in western Cabada, are endeavoring to cause a change in sentiment by saying that uniess the weather becomes milder so that seeding may become general, there will be a falling off in the acreage seeded
